The Filson has one of the finest Civil War manuscript collections in the state, featured along with artifacts in the new exhibit “United We Stand - Divided We

Fall.” The exhibit, which commemorates the sesquicentennial of the beginning of the Civil War, will focus on the war in Kentucky and the Ohio Valley region. The exhibit takes a thematic, rather than chronolog-

ical, approach to the war, starting in the 1850’s and focusing on the growing division between

the North and South. The exhibit features artifacts such as flags, weapons, uniforms, dresses, and medical instruments. Among the manuscripts, there are letters, documents, photos, and prints describing camp life, death and mourning, Civil War-era medicine, prisoners of war, communication, and women and the home front. All items displayed belong to The Filson’s collections.

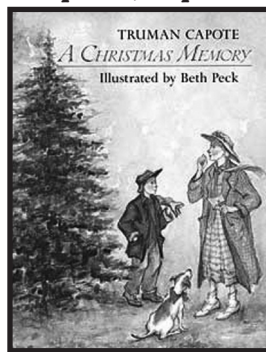

Clear as Mud: Early 20th Century Kentucky Art Pottery

Warren Payne, editor of *Clear as Mud: Early 20th Century Kentucky Art Pottery*, will discuss the book – the first and only history of the subject – at The Filson on December 13. His wife, Julie, who designed the book and did the photography, will also participate.

Struck by the lack of any organized or centralized information about pottery produced in Kentucky from 1900 to World War II, the authors contacted pottery collector/scholars to contribute chapters for the book. This book familiarizes us with the works of potters such as Bybee, Waco, and Hadley.

Clear as Mud won the 2011 Independent Publisher (IPPY) Book Awards Bronze for Best South-East Regional Non-Fiction. It was also the recipient of a 2011 Kentucky History Award for a publication in its class.

Warren and Julie Payne are collectors and private art dealers in Louisville. He is retired from *The Courier-Journal*, and she is retired from the University of Louisville. *Reservations are suggested.*

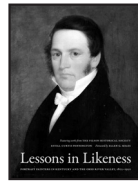

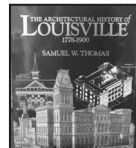

Lessons in Likeness: Portrait Painters in Kentucky and the Ohio River Valley, 1802-1920 - **Estill Curtis Pennington**

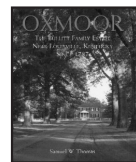
