Gustavis R A Brown aforesaid to sell and dispose of her landed and free-
hold estate to a considerable amount the proceeds of which sales has been
applied to the discharge of his debts exclusively, and also for and in
consideration, the sum of One Dollar current money of Kentucky so
him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath
hath given, granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth
give, grant, bargain & sell unto the said Gideon Brown his Execu-
tors, Administrators and assigns the following described land & property
to wit. The plantation whereon the said Gustavis R A Brown now resides
situate on the Brushy fork of Sinking creek and is the land lot
of Richard Bibb & containing between six & seven hundred acres -
Negroes Carter, Godfrey, Emanuel, Bob, Mary, Molly, Jenny
and William together with all my household furniture of every de-
scription Plate, Beds &c of every description, also all my kitchen
furniture, Farming utensils and implements of husbandry in-
cluding Wagons, Carts, Plows &c and all my stock of every

description horses, cows, sheep & hogs, poultry &c to have and to hold the above described land, negroes and other property forever in trust to and for the uses, intents and purposes hereafter mentioned that is to say in trust for the use and benefit of the above named Mr Caroline Elisabeth Brown and her children which she now has and such other children as the said Gustavis R A Brown ^{said} his wife may hereafter have, and in trust that he the said Gideon Brown will permit her the said Caroline Elisabeth Brown and her children to use, possess and enjoy the above described land and other property during the natural life of him the said Gustavis R A Brown and further that immediately after the death of him the said Gustavis R A Brown that he the said Gideon Brown his heirs &c shall convey to the said Caroline Elisabeth Brown and her children or such them as are then living the above described land, negroes and other property or such of it as is then remaining ~~not~~ destroyed by time accident or made use of for the use and benefit of the said Caroline Elisabeth Brown and children and also upon this further trust that whenever it shall appear beneficial for the said Caroline Elisabeth Brown and family to sell any part of the above described property he the said Gideon Brown shall by the consent and approbation of the said Caroline Elisabeth ^{Brown} have a right to sell & convey the same which transfer shall be valid & In Testimony whereof they the said Gustavis R A Brown & gideon Brown have hereunto set their hands & seals the date first


