John Wilson and his family , Manny Wilson Curry, with the rest, all hetenged and worshiped at Chillinguages Church, then Columbia now Montaur County, Pa., and that is where many of them are buried. It is a long time since I have been there. John Wilson's ascend daughter, Hargaret, My grandaother, and his eighth daughter, Ruhanah, both married men by the name of Johnston, and yet no relation to each other. One moved to Cincinnatio., as you said: the other had but one shild - my mother - and her husband my grandfather, died young, and she being a great sufferer from rhommation, was with her little daughter taken home by her father, until hisdeath.

I think you must have misinformed about your great SKRE great grandwother being proud and heaghty, for my mother always spoke of her as being a vary mild and lovely christian seven, and had many

sorrows and disapointments.

John Wilson's sons, Hancy Wilson Curry's brothers all left home young; two of them - James and John + went to York state, and married. One of them sarried a very prend and haught, woman, that did not even try to be pleasant with her hapband's old parents when she visited them; perhaps that is the one you heard of? Such Wilson, the youngest son married and raised his family and died in Wisconsin. I do not know how many children he had bet knew of one daughter, Hadaline, I never saw her but often read the beautiful letters she wrote to Hother, I do not think they ever met but kept up a lively correspondence for many years, then she married, not so very young either, and then her father died, and then the correspondence ceased. I suppose that the, as well as her gother, has passed the shores of time long ere this.

I think that Mother having lived with her grandfather so long makes no know what I do about them. He was " Squire " a great many years, as well as County Surveyor, and always went by the name of

" Squire John Wilson."

The sons all lived to be over eighty, the as old as eighty-seven, but the doughters with one exception died much younger.

Sallie, fifth daughter of John and Hargaret Vilson, Make married a man by the mace of Vandyke and lived in Bradford County, Pa., they had four sons I think, the oldest one was called Henry. I was about twenty years old when I met him, he was a railread contractorand and one day while everseing some work he met with an accident by which he lost his sight, and lived in total blindness for several years. He was a fine looking man; his only sister married a man named Wright? but I think she is dead, I know nothing of her family, I think they all

John and Margaret Wilson's third daughter. Jane Wilson, married a man by the name of Clark, Robert Clark. She lived to be over eighty, raised a large facily at but they are all dead. The two younger sisters of whom you spoke . Cathering the youngest one, had in 1850 a stroke , the Drs. called it Palsy. It left her very helpless, her reasoning faculties were clear, but her speech was very much impaired, she died in 1854, aged 54 years. The other maiden aunt you spoke of . Mary Wilson, died Dec. 3rd., 1858, aged 71 years. They are both buried in Chillisquague graveyard.

Well this is the substance of what I knew of our Great grandfather's family: perhaps I HAN may find out something more, if so will let you know if you wish it.

Bow I will write sepathing of my own family and why my

maiden name was Wilson.

About the year 1814, there ZAMENIEN were two brothers by the name of Wilson with their young wives came from Junietts Co. bought farms and settled almost adjoining farmste our greatgrandfather, but were not at all related. Their names were William and John Wilson. They both raised large families, and when William Wilson's family grew up the oldest son, Joseph, parried Margaret Campble Johnston, my mother. My father died in 1881, my mother died in 1895, in her 84th., year.

By parents raised a family of five, and I am their oldest child. There were two daughters and three sons, all married and living except my sister, she died in 1876.

I was married in 1862 to William Rote of Montour County. We were blessed with five children, two sons and three daughters: the sons both died when about five years old. It oldest daughter is muried, but MR both my younger ones died in young girlhood, one was seventoen, the other also in 1809, at the age of nineteen: then last Rebruary, husband was taxen from me and I fool to be left alone. This I have had many joys through life. I have had great sorrow.

If there is any thing also you want to know write, and if I can I will tell you. I can copy family record, if you wish.

JOHN WILSON CURRY AND HIS FOUNDRIES

There is not much known of my paternal great grandfather, John W. Curry. We know that in some way he was related to James Wilson, signer of the "Declaration of Independence" for Pennsylvania. His, John's grandfather was in some way a hero in The American Revolution and was scalped by Indians at Fort Meade, Pennsylvania. There is a statue honoring him in Danville, Pennsylvania.

There are two accounts of John Curry's birthplace. One of these being in Pennsylvania and one in Louisville, Kentucky in 1796. Which of these is correct, I do not know. I know nothing of his personal life since nothing was passed down to me.

I do know that at the time prior to 1832, he lived at 9th and Main and sometime before 1832, he moved to 10th and Market because my grandfather was born there in 1832.

He, John was a foundry man or as the old books stated, a moulder. Off and on, the name of the business changed, but his name was always in it. During and after the Civil War, his name disappeared entirely and I do know that he left Louisville and died an embittered man in Zanesville, Ohio in 1877.

I do know that his foundry operations were big for those days and he became wealthy.

This is an account of his and his partners first business taken from "HISTORY OF THE OHIO FALLS CITIES AND THEIR COUNTIES" - Page 231.

In 1831, the first foundry in Louisville went out of business and was succeeded by Messrs. D. S. Beatty, John Curry and Jacob Beckwith. Here, casting and steam engine business was carried on successfully.

The first air furnace of any value was erected by them. They also built the first regular boring mill and substituted the blowing cylinder instead of the common wood and leather bellows. It has become a very prominent and successful business in Louisville.

In 1844, the Jefferson Foundry was started by Curry and Miller and steam machinery and engines were manufactured at the foundry on 9th Street between Main and Water.

The employment was very extensive for those times. There were a hundred hands, 75 worked in the foundry and machine shop and the balance on the various new and old boats in the port. Engines and machinery compared with any in the union and in some cases, were better.

The foundry consumed 500 tons of pig iron annually, 75 tons of boiler and sheet iron and 100 tons of bar iron, coming chiefly from Tennessee. The operation used 30,000 bushels of coal.

This is about all that I know. I am enclosing some pictures and ads from the old city directories. I am also enclosing some information on Dennis Long and how he came to Louisville.


THE GRAINGER FAMILY

Of course little is known of the Grainger family besides what I enclose here. William Grainger and his wife, Elizabeth came from Wales some time around 1823. They settled in Louisville and their daughter, Mary Anne married my grandfather in 1850.

In the first city directory (1832), he is listed as a malster, probably meaning a brewer. He joined the first brewery in the city which was Metcalfe & Son and the company later became Metcalfe & Grainger, Grainger & Sons and at the time of the Civil War, they seem to have become extinct. The four younger children died, and were buried at sea. Only son James, age 10, survived. He lived with his parents in Virginia. Four more children were born to the older James and wife in America.

JAMES CURRY, JR.

In 1774 James Jr. served as a private in Dunerore's War with the Indians. In 1776 he joined the 8th Infantry, Continental Line. Became 2nd Lt. in December, 1776; 1st Lt. on June 24, 1777. Transferred to 4th Virginia Infantry September 14, 1778. Made Captain September 23, 1779. Fought at Brandywine, Germantown, Valley Forge. Taken prisoner at Charleston, 1760. Exchanged in 1781. On the staff of General Gist. Tounded at Yorktown. With Washington at entry of New York, 1783.

We Returned to Virginia after Revolution ended. Virginia gave land grants in Chio Territory as pay for soldiers' service in the Revolution. James' grant was in the area now occupied by Columbus, Chio. He never took up the claim. He was Brigade Inspector of the Virginia Militia. He was made Colonel in the Chio Militia during the War of 1812. He was too old for front line duty then, so drilled troops all of that time. After the War ended he returned to Virginia, where he became Clerk of Court in Augusta County, Virginia. State Representative from Radison County, Ohio, 1819-20. He introduced the bill which passed, to erect Union County, Ohio. Became Associate Judge in Union County, Ohio, 1825-27.

I have been directed to you by many experienced genealogical researchers who have told me that your organization is the best resource for tracing early Kentucky ancestors. I am trying to find information on my great-great-greatgrandfather ROBERT CURRY.

He is listed on the 1850 and 1860 Ohio census (Bloom Township, Fairfield County) as born in Kentucky.

He is buried in the Lithopolis Cemetery, Lithopolis, Bloom Township, Fairfield County, Ohio. His tombstone inscription says died January 1867, age 84 years. If this information is correct, he would have been born in Kentucky in about 1782-83.

He married Margaret Ann (Ball) Gregg, widow of Samuel Gregg and daughter of John and Ann Ball of Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

Robert Curry and Margaret Ann (Ball) Gregg had at least two children--William N. Curry, 1818-1889, listed as born in Pennsylvania (my great-greatgrandfather) and Elias Bailey Curry, 1828-1914, variously listed as born in Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Ohio.

I see that we have a correspondence and inquiry file on the surname Curry that seems to take your line back to Robert Curry (1741-1780) born Belfast, Ireland who married Jane McWilliams (1750-1825). It would take more searching than we have time for to put the details in order.

In our Moore family file I do not readily find anything that seems to relate to the Louisville Moores. The correspondence would show the names of the interested inquirers, but much of it is quite old.

In the Louisville city directories between 1852 and 1866 I see that Richard M. Moore was a watchman, bill poster, grocer, and county coroner, but I do not have any associated family information, on him. The index of wills probated in Jefferson Co. through 1919 does not include a Richard Moore.

Our Filson Club History Quarterly is sent with Club membership at \$18 per year, or separately at \$10 per year. It contains scholarly articles on Kentucky history, but no queries and nothing genealogical except an occasional article on a family.



A. R., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 3, 1907, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.



Mr. Isaacs:

I have looked in various sources for information and can give you a good many leads to pursue further.

We have in our Curry family correspondence file some letters from Cora C. Curry of Washington D.C. probably given to us many years ago by her cousin Lillian M. Isaacs, or by her family.

In 1917 Cora and one or more of her 5 sisters were professional genealogists, but the letters we have were written in the early 1900's. Cora was born in 1852.

I have pieced together from these letters a rough chart which you can use for further searbing. I have not been able to see much connection with Union Co. Kentucky, although there were 12 Curry households in Uneon Co. in 1850, there are various indications in the letters that the Currys, Herrons and others were established in Pennsylvania (Montour Co. and its predecessors) and Ohio (Muskingum Co. and its predecessors). There is a Union Co. in both of those states, and that may have some connection. I notice that Union is very close to Montour.

The chart speaks for itself but has some uncertainies, many omissions, and probably some mistates.

Apparently John Wilson Curry and wife Theodoria Herron came to Louisvilèe soon after marriage (1820's) from Pennsylvania or from Zanesville. Ohio. Cora says that John and his brother Hugh (who married Mary Ann Blue) were both in Louisville in 1876, and that descendants named Fordan L. and Clarence G. Curry were in Louisville in 1904.

Richard Isaacs is listed in the 1855 Louisville City directory as a partner with John R. Emmit in Isaacs & Emmit, retail dry goods on 4th St. between Market and Jefferson, both men lived at the store. In 1859 Richard is living on Chestnut Street. In 1865 his residence is given as "country", and in 1869 as corner of Hancock and Broadway. In 1872, his occupation is real estate agent with Mr. Crum, still living on Broadway. An 1876 atlas of Louisville shows Mrs. T. Isaacs as owner of s.w. corner at Hancock St, and R. Isaacs as owner of a vacant let west of that residence.

The Sehon Chapel was Methodist Episcopal, corner Third and Guthrie Sts; some intersection as the later Trinity M.E. Church, now Trinity Towers apartments and Church, but I don't know if it is exactly the same sppt.

I do not find a will of Richard Isaacs in the Jefferson Co. index through 1919.

I would assume that there is more information to be found in our library and in the Nefferson Co. court house, as well as the Pennsylvania and Ohio records. We can provide names of searbhers in this area if you wish.

Others were Margaret, Sarah, Catherine, Thomas Jr. and Jane.

The compiler does not include the wife's name of Daniel Curry Sr. but list his first son as Daniel Curry Jr. born 3/2/1784 and married twice. Daniel Curry's siblings are listed as Mary; Elizabeth; Hannah and Lettie. Daniel Curry Jr. Married 1st 10/8/1800 in Jefferson Co. Ky, Susannah Stafford; b. 12/11/1784 and who died 4/25/1826, in Jefferson Co., daughter of Thomas and Eve (Whipys) children were Thomas S. Curry b. 3/2/1804 who married Malinda Murphy. Other children of Daniel Curry Jr. are Prescilla; Sophia; Martha; Sarah; Susan; William; Emily; Pauline.

Thomas S. Curry died 12/1/1891 in Adams Co. Illinois and married 10/11/1824 in Jefferson Co. Malinda Murphy b. 11/6/1807 and dies 4/23/1879 in Adams Co. Ill. In response to your letter of November 30, 1990, I plan to visit your Society in the next year, therefore I do not anticipate the need of a researcher there. If such becomes feasible, I will contact you for some names.

My earlier letter may have created some confusion in the marriage in Montgomery County. From what I can gather, Henry and Nancy Shields Curry settled on the Little Sandy River at Crane Creek on a large tract of land, possibly 2,000 acres, with six slaves and remained there throughout their lives. Both are buried nearby in the Anglin Cemetery.

I am attaching information which I copied from the Bible of Henry Sloan Curry, much of which was recorded after his death around 1828. Please use it as you deem proper.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Thank you for your response to my earlier inquiry on my ancestor, ROBERT CURRY. Enclosed is my check for \$15.00 to request research on him.

Regarding the information I have on Robert Curry, I will restate what I had in my earlier letter. He is listed on the 1850 and 1860 Ohio census (Bloom Township, Fairfield County) as born in Kentucky. He is listed as 67 years old in 1850 and 76 years old on the 1860 census.

He is buried in the Lithopolis Cemetery, Lithopolis, Bloom Township, Fairfield, Ohio. His tombstone inscription says he died in January 1867, age 84 years. If this information is correct, he would have been born in Kentucky in about 1782-84.

He married Margaret Ann (Ball) Gregg, widow of Samuel Gregg of Redstone Township, Fayette County, Pennsylvania. She was the daughter of John and Ann Ball of Luzern Township, Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

Robert Curry and Margaret Ann (Ball) Gregg had at least two children--William N. Curry, 1818-1889, listed as born in Pennsylvania (my great-greatgrandfather) and Elias Bailey Curry, 1828-1914, variously listed as born in Pennsylvania, Virginia and Ohio.

I have also found a Robert Curry, that appears to be my ancestor, in the 1820 Pennsylvania census (117 Redstone Township, Fayette County). This looks like a fairly close match to what I know of him at that time.

Once again, as I stated in my earlier request, I am looking for any record that could verify that ROBERT CURRY was born in Kentucky and who his parents were. I am also enclosing a family history outline that I have put together from my search in the last several years. Any assistance you can provided me will be greatly appreciated.

This letter is in answer to one from Mr. Jack Holshueter of October 9th addressed to Mrs. Dorothy Thomas Cullen. Mrs. Cullen retired from the staff of The Filson Club in February, 1968.

Our holdings of Richard M. Johnson papers have been accumulated piecemeal over the years as gifts and purchased and did not come to us in a body. Most of them are written by Johnson to several individuals, but none of them are to or from James R. Curry or Charles Bracken.

There are no entries for either Bracken or Curry in our manuscript catalog or our catalog of printed materials, with the exception of a few articles printed in the Wisconsin Historical Collections. We have no information file on either of them, nor is there any information on them in our family files or various Kentucky biographical encyclopedias or Perrin's History of Kentucky, which contains a section on Harrison County.

There is some biographical material on Curry in Mrs. Lucinda Boyd's Chronicles of Cynthiana and other chronicles, Cincinnati, Robert Clarke & Co., 1894; on pages 75-87 appears "Short Sketch of Judge James R. Curry's Life By Himself." The connection between the Currys and Deshas is contained in G. Glenn Clift, Governors of Kentucky, 1792-1942. Cynthiana, Ky., 1942, pages 29-30. According to Clift, John R. Besha, son of Gov. Joseph Desha, married in 1838, Mary Curry, daughter of Judge James R. Curry. Their daughter, Issa Desha, married William Campbell Preston Breckinridge of Lexington. Desha Breckinridge, longtime editor of the Lexington newspaper, was their son.

You may be able to obtain further information on the family history of the Curry and Bracken families from the Kentucky Historical Society in Frankfort and the Department of Special Collections, Margaret King Library, University of Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky.

There is a biographical sketch of James A. Curry of Harrodsburg, Mercer County, a son of James and Katherine (Stagg) Curry, who was a Henry Clay Whig, on pages 83-85 of Biographical Cyclopedia of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Chicago, 1896. He may be a relative of Judge Curry.

As for the connection of Bracken and Curry with Henry Clay, I have not found any kinship. Clay was not from Harrison County, as Mr. Holzhueter indicates, but from Fayette Gounty. Clay was born in Hanover County, Virginia in 1777. Clay's granddaughter, a McDowell, married Desha Breckinridge, a great-grandson of Judge Curry, but that would be too late a connection for your study. For Madeline McDowell's descent from Henry Clay, see Mary Rogers Clay, The Clay Family, Filson Club Publications, No. 11, Louisville, 1899, pp. 178, 208-209.

In addition to the Historical Society and the University of Kentucky, The Kentucky Library at Western Kentucky University, Bowling Green, Kentucky has a good collection on the state and may have material on Curry or Bracken.

We can provide a photocopy of the James R. Curry memoir from Mrs. Boyd's book for you, if you want it. We have an Apeco copy machine which makes a good copy and the book is small enough that we can get two pages per copy for you.

I wish we had more information for your project and I wish you the best in your search for information on the Brackens and Currys. There are two references to James R. Curry during the Civil War in Volume 1 of Rhehard H. Collins' <u>History of Kentucky</u>, which may be of some use to you.

CURRY Family

Thomas Curry is the first of the Curry name which I have been able to positively identify as being in my line. From family records and from statements made by his children to later census takers, we believe he was an emigrant from Scotland. He came to America after December 18, 1767, the date of birth of daughter Mary, as she was born in Scotland.

From deed records in Jefferson Co., Ky. we know his wife's name to have been Sally.

From Jeff. Co., Ky. marriage records we know of dau. Catherine who m. James Farrow, July 7, 1808; Margaret who m. Bartlett Asher, March 21, 1791; Sally or Sarah, who m. Isaac Brazier Oct. 12, 1803; and my ancestor, Mary, who m. Rodham Seaton, Aug. 13, 1787.

From a deed dated July 10, 1786 in which Daniel Durry promises to care for his parents in exchange for the conveyance of real estate, we know Daniel to also be a child of Thomas and Sally Curry. The 1810 census of Jeff. Co., My. lists Edward Currie and two Daniels.

My line of descent is from Rodham and Mary Gurry Seaton. Their dau. Elizabeth m. Joseph Donaldson, and in turn, their dau. Martha Donaldson m. Milo D. Littell, my great graadfather.

I have considerable information on the allied lines, but have nothing of any consequence except the above on the CURRY line. I certainly would appreciate some help along this line.

In Green County Vital Statistics I see the death of Flora Curry who died with croup, 11/17/1878. She being the daughter of T. and M. Curry.

I seem to have hit a dead end in searching for one of my Kentucky ancestors, and your name was given to me, as one who has helped solve many Kentucky genealogy problems.

My ancestor, Thomas M. Curry, married Mary Russell in August of 1846, and they appeard in U. S. Census schedules in 1850 and 1960 with their children. In 1870, Mary Curry was listed as head of household with her children. In 1880 schedule, Mary L. Curry was listed in the household of Aron T. Curry as his sister—in—law. All this was in Greene County, Kentucky.

I checked with the courthouse fo r death records and wills, but they had nothing.

Since he left the scene between 1860 and 1870, I thought he may have perished in the War Between The States and since Kentucky was divided in that war, I do not know where to look for information.

If you can be of any help in this search, I will appreciate it very much.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Thank you for your response to my earlier inquiry on my ancestor, ROBERT CURRY. Enclosed is my check for \$15.00 to request research on him.

Regarding the information I have on Robert Curry, I will restate what I had in my earlier letter. He is listed on the 1850 and 1860 Ohio census (Bloom Township, Fairfield County) as born in Kentucky. He is listed as 67 years old in 1850 and 76 years old on the 1860 census.

He is buried in the Lithopolis Cemetery, Lithopolis, Bloom Township, Fairfield, Ohio. His tombstone inscription says he died in January 1867, age 84 years. If this information is correct, he would have been born in Kentucky in about 1782-84.

He married Margaret Ann (Ball) Gregg, widow of Samuel Gregg of Redstone Township, Fayette County, Pennsylvania. She was the daughter of John and Ann Ball of Luzern Township, Fayette County, Pennsylvania.

Robert Curry and Margaret Ann (Ball) Gregg had at least two children--William N. Curry, 1818-1889, listed as born in Pennsylvania (my great-greatgrandfather) and Elias Bailey Curry, 1828-1914, variously listed as born in Pennsylvania, Virginia and Ohio.

Dear Sir:

Knowing that you have a vast amount of information about the history and people of Kentucky, would it be possible for you to check your files and give me some information about the Curry and Tucker families of Nelson County? I am descended from these families but have been unable to learn anything about them before 1860, when I found them on the census of St. Clair County, Illinois.

William H. Curry, born about 1826 at Bardstown, Nelson County. Rachel Angeline Tucker, born about 1834, also in Bardstown. They were married about 1851/2. My grandmother, their daughter, was born in Bardstown in 1854. A family member advises me that both of them came from families who owned land; Rachel Tucker's family owned slaves. Also a report that at one time William Curry was tried and convicted for murder.

It is taken from History of Greenup County by Nina Mitchell Boggs and Mabel Lee Mackoy (Louisville, Kentucky: 1951). The cost of this verifax copy is fifty cents which you can send us. Our Greenup County marriages cover the period between 1804 and 1838. I did not find any of your Currys in the records. I regret to say. The county clerk of Greenup, Kentucky may be able to give you the name of a local person who would be able to contimus research on your family lines. You will note that Harry Curry married Mancy Shields and his son. Hugh, married Margaret Bellew so you have these additional lines to follow and explore. Our Greenup County material does not indicate the exact dates when the Currys arrived in Greenup County. We do have census records but, as our staff is small, we do not have the time to undertake this type of research. HISTORY OF COLUMBIA AND MONTOUR COUNTIES.

Robert Curry is numbered among the earliest settlers in this part of Pennsylvania. He was born in the North of Ireland June 9,(1) 1741; educated in the schools of his native country where his father was a well-te-do linen manufacturer. He emigrated to America in 1772, settling on Mahoning Creek in what is now valley township, Mantour County, Pa., and there followed farming. He was killed and scalped by the Indians June 9, 1780. He was a Presbyterian in religious belief, and was one of the first to give his money and influence toward the propogation of religion in these parts, and was also a trustee in his church.

he married Jane McWilliams in Belfast, Ireland, and four children were born to them. James, who was born in Ireland, grow to manhood and settled in Ohio; Robert who settled in the North Branch of the Susquehanna River; William who settled on the home place in Valley Township, Columbia County, (new Montour County), Pa., and Jane, the first white child born between the North and West branches of the Susquehanna River, - married to Robert McWilliams. These sons were well-to-do farmers and noted for their honesty and integrity.

Exgracts from a letter written in May, 1904, by Mrs. Essa Gurry

of John Wilson Curry of Louisville, Ky., who was born February 21, 1796, in

Northumberland Co., near Mooresburg, now Montour County, Pa., died December 11, 1877

in Louisville, Ky. His wife, Theodosis Herrin (Herring), who was born near Trenton, N. J., December 24, 1807, died at Bonham, Texas, January 31, 1898. They were married at Zanesville, Ohio, in 1823.

"Our great grandfather, our father's grandfather, was one of the first or earliest settlers in that part of Pennsylvania."

The people lived in forts or block houses, as you know, cultivating their fields with their guns by their side, in danger of attack from the Indians at any time. History tells us all that, you know. He was one of those pioneers, and this is the story as Mother told me but a short time before her death. They had a family of six (four) children, I think. The youngest an infant of a few weeks. (our grandfather was one of them, of course.) Every day he, as the other man, went to the field to plough. At moon their wives took their dinner out to them. So one day great grandmother went to the field as usual with her husband's dimner, and as he ate it they were surprised by a band of Indians. He was killed and scalped and she taken prisoner. Bound and guarded she travelled for the rest of the day until night fall. Then they stopped, built their fire, ate their supper and stretched themselves on the ground with feet to the fire in a circle. She was bound securely with thongs at the wrists and ankles. Then a stronger thong was put across her waist or body with the ends attached to an Indian on either side of her. To add to her misery and discomfort a drissling rain began to fall. Thinking of her little baby and the other children, and having the horrid sight of her dead andscalped husband before her, can be imagined better than described. In those days all women wore a small pair of scissors attached to a tape that reached nearly to the feet, and the tape looped around the belt of their aprons. So she happened to think of her scissors and began very carefully to feel for the tape. Succeeding in her efforts, she slowly drew the scissors up until she could get them in her hands, then she worked the blade under the thongs around her waist and freed

her hands. Waiting to see if her movements had awakened either of her guards. she slowly out the thong across her body. Again waiting she ventured to slowly rise to a sitting posture and cut the feet free. Now came the most daring part of all, but what will not a mother venture for her children. Slowly and noiselessly she turned herself over and drew herself from between her captors. Rising on her hands and knees she crept away many yards, or until she thought it safe to arise to her feet. Then listening to see if she had been missed, and all being quiet, she ran cautiously, as fast as she could in the darkness, trying to get as far as possible from the dreaded savages; but, unfortunately, they swoke and finding their captive gone gave the alarm. Immediately torches were lighted and the coarch began. Hearing their cries, she gave herself up for lost, but like those brave women resolved still to try and escape. Seeing the light of the distant torches she determined to hide herself. Running to a large log she saw lying near, she threw herself down behind it. As she did so, she found it was hollow, and crept into it as far as she could, which seems to have been a very considerable distance, as it completely concealed her. The Indians came and sat on the log and talked, spark from one of the torches burned a hole in her apren. After hunting around for some time they went in another direction. Waiting for a long time until sure they were not lurking eround, she crept out and travelled in an opposite direction until she fortunately met a party from the fort in search of her. Her husband was buried and she toiled on and raised the children, from une of whom (James) we are descended by our father. John Wilson Curry."

N.B. - J. M. Battle in The History of Montour Co. tells this story practically the same;

[&]quot;Cousin William Wallace Curry you speak of is the head of the family, being the eldest of the race." Born in Louisville, Ky., February 13, 1824.

Lieut. Robert Curry, a soldier of the Revolution, was killed near Mead Steekade, three miles below Danville, Pa., was buried with the honors of war in the Mahoning Presbyterian Cemetery.

His wife, Jane McWilliams Curry, died in 1825, and was buried beside her husband. Their remains were removed in 1903 to the new Presbyterian Cometery. Donniele, Montan Co. Pa.
