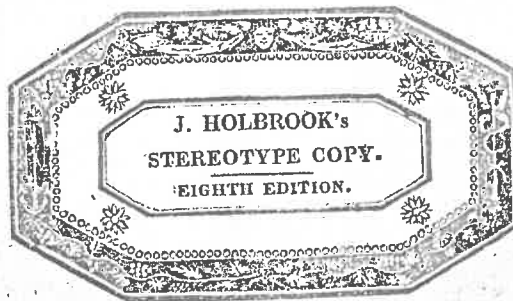

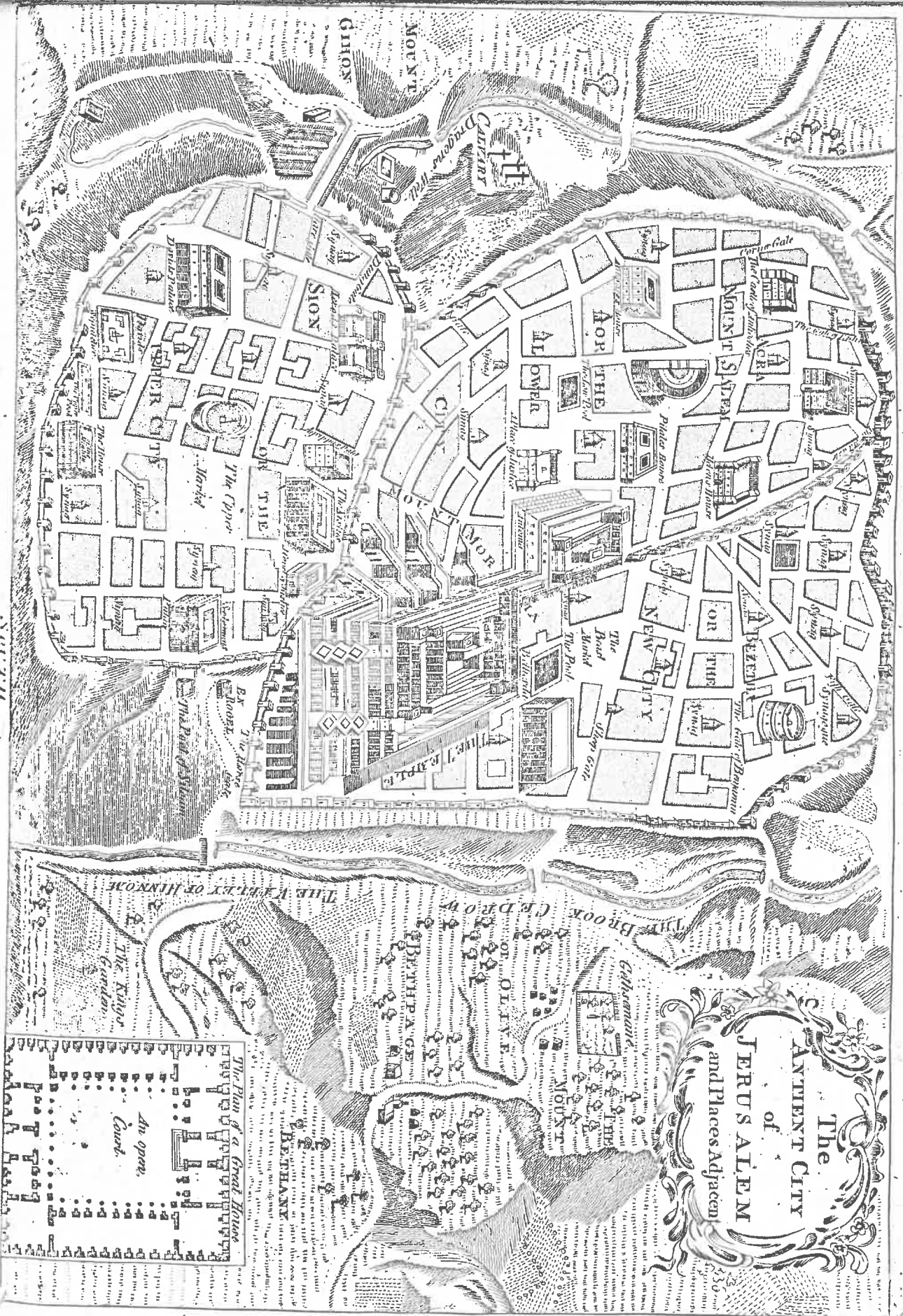

No one of this day and age knows why the Pepper Coat of Arms has the various figures on it, for it obviously was for a personal reason. Symbolically "stag": denotes Policy, Peace and Harmony — 1st and 4th Quarters, (Red) signifies Courage; Gold: Generosity and Elevation of Mind; Silver: Sincerity and Peace; Griffin: (Lion and Half Eagle) Guardian of the Treasury; Bend: (diagonal Silver Bar) high Military rank; Vair: (fur) denotes Royalty; Semper Erectus: (motto) Always Erect.

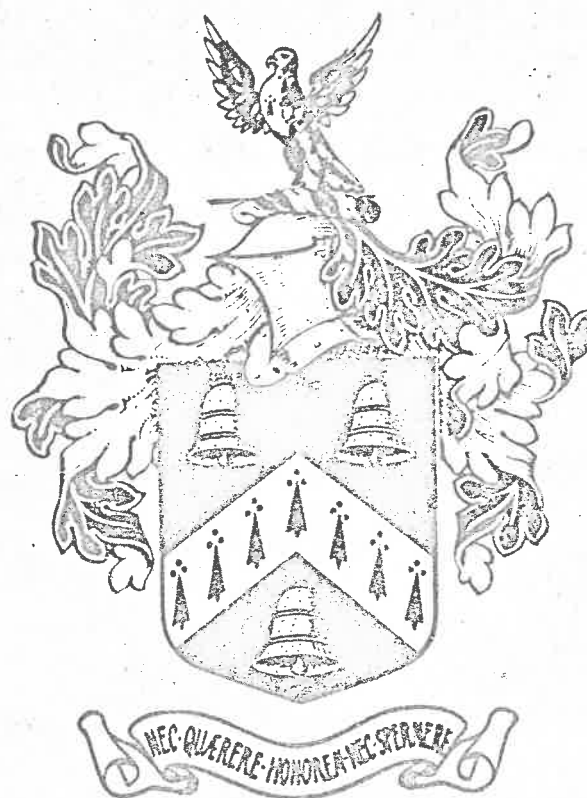

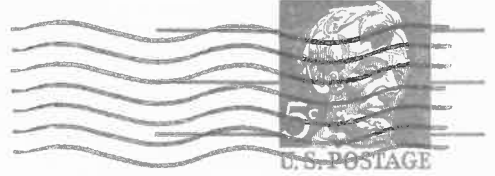

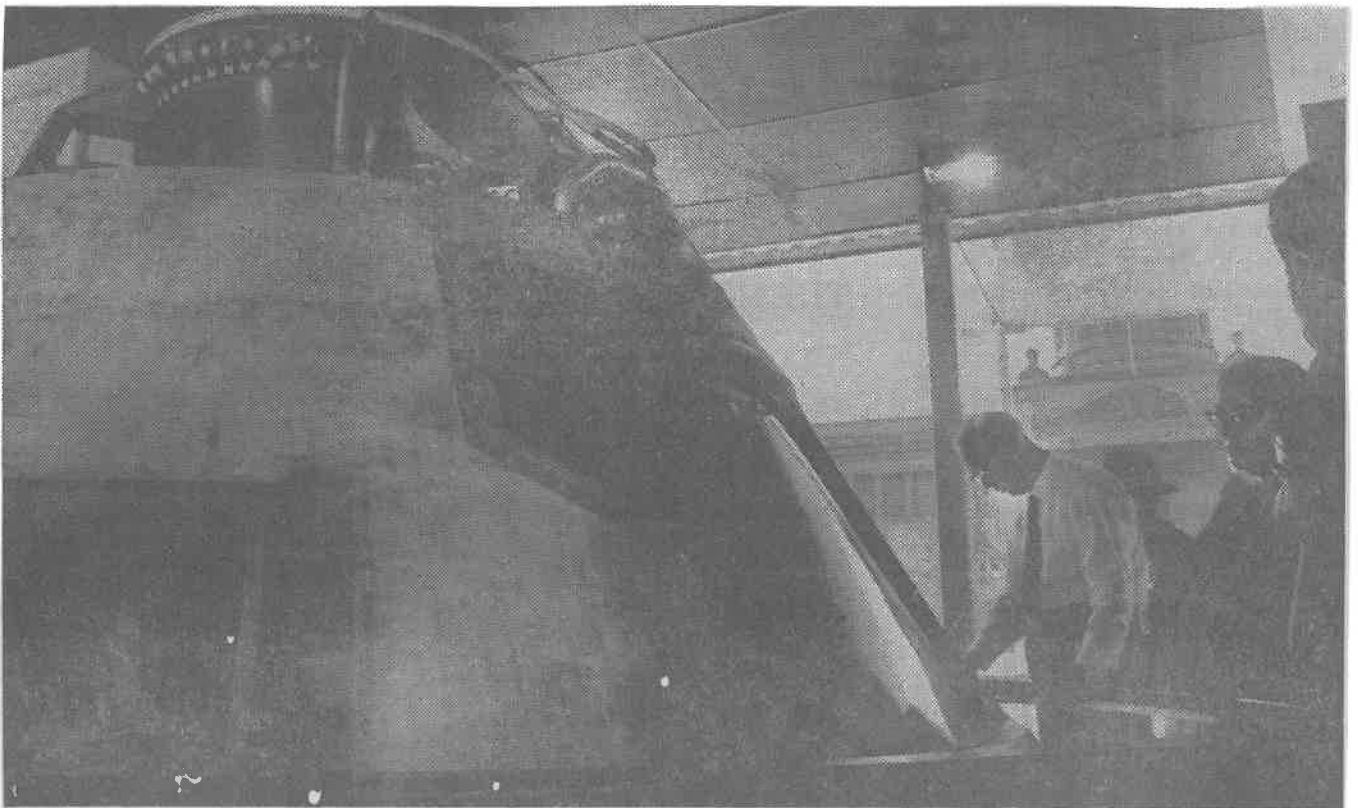
