Obituary for Mrs. Elizabeth Buckner, by C. Y. Chester. No date. MDS, 2 pp.

Notes death of EAB on January 6 [no year] at residence of Major D. R. Coulter in Union County, AR. Relates details of her life: birth in 1801 to Col> James Morehead of Fauquier County, Virginia; removal to Warren County, Kentucky at age 10; marriage at age 18 to Aylett H. Buckner; move in 1843 to Arkansas and returned to Kentucky in 1858. "Forced to leave her home by the despotism at Washington" she returned to AR; died a few weeks later after pneumonia attack. Buried in Coulter family plot alongside husband. A good Presbyterian.

Thomas J. Wood, Dayton, OH to Governor S. B. Buckner, Frankfort, Kentucky. Postmarked April 7, 1890. Envelope.

J. P. Nuckols, Adjutant General, Headquarters Kentucky State Guard, Frankfort, June 1883. General Orders No. 3. Published pamphlet, 2 pp.

Governor Blackburn announces that death of Lieutenant Charles B. Bly of the Louisville Light Artillery on June 2, 1883. Relates life and career of Bly.

Kentucky Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, George T. Wood, Treasurer, Louisville, Kentucky to General Simon Bolivar Buckner, Rio, Ky. Postmarked May 24, 1911. Typescript, unsigned. 6 pp and envelope.

Typed copy of minutes of a meeting of the Sons of the American Revolution at which SBB donated a flag and gave a speech.

*The Saints' Jubilee, A Satire*. Published by Matt R. Cullen, Bookseller and Stationer, St. Louis, Mo. August 29, 1865. Printed booklet. 24 pp.

"Respectfully dedicated to all the 'Saints' in and out of the Freedmen's Bureau." Satire against the Radical Republicans.

William D. Buckner, The National City Bank of New York, to Lieut. Col. Simon Bolivar Buckner, Jr., United States Military Academy, West Point, New York. December 29, 1933. TL, TD, 3 p. and envelope.

Letter from William D. Buckner (dictated) describing old will, a copy of which is enclosed; mentions a unique Christmas card sent by SBB Jr., and his health. Enclosure is a copy of the will of Henry Garnett, February 21, 1815. Mentions disposal of slaves and property.

Unknown to Simon B. Buckner Ex. Gen. Louisville, KY, n.p., n.d. Envelope. Stamp of Andrew Jackson, 2 cents.

“Turner H. Buckner began the study of the latin language on the 10<sup>th</sup> of March 1834.”  
War Department, War Records Office, Washington, D.C. to General S. B. Buckner, Louisville,  
KY [crossed out and “Rio, Hart Co. KY” written on]. August 20, 1892. Envelope.

Note on envelope says, “Will the Post Master at Louisville Please forward this letter to  
General Buckner’s present address if he is not in Louisville or if this address is unknown return  
to Marcus G. Wright, War Dept. Washington, D.C.” Another note says, “Re: Bragg.” Empty.

Buckner and Pillow – 1850.

Printed sheet (modern) regarding Gideon Pillow’s run for U. S. Senate in 1850, his  
distortion of facts regarding the Mexican War and General Winfield Scott, and Simon Bolivar  
Buckner’s anonymous articles in the Nashville newspapers “skewering Pillow.”
