JANUARY 1931

Thursday 13<sup>00</sup> AM 120, 7<sup>00</sup> 10<sup>45</sup> PM

New Year's Day Mama disappointed me again. I thought sure she would spend today with me but she has a cold. I have a head cold that makes me feel every way but good. At home, Humah!

Friday 2 5<sup>00</sup> AM 1<sup>00</sup>, 5<sup>30</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

My cold has just about gotten the best of me. Toots got me a bottle of Vaper's it seems to be real good to open up your head, and I sure need something.

Saturday 3 2<sup>30</sup>, 7<sup>50</sup> AM 6<sup>00</sup>, 11<sup>20</sup> PM

Cousin Angie would bring breakfast to me while in bed. I did not want one bite but when she brought it I had to eat. Hot pancakes and syrup I ate 6 cakes.

Mrs + Mrs Riley, Toots, and Mrs Riley's sisters brought me back to W.H. It was the first time I have been in fog so thick you could not see. Box of candy from Sister waiting me.

Monday 5 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup>

Lucky for me that I come back last night. The weather is sure bad today. My cold is not getting any better very fast. Everybody seems glad to see me back even Dr. Fisher.

Tuesday 6 4<sup>20</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>10</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Got all the work today. Buy Bottle Throat Examination, Chest Examination and a Parathyrin shot + throat Treatment I am tired and sick at my stomach.

Wednesday 7 2<sup>00</sup>, 7<sup>00</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup>, 10<sup>10</sup> PM

Toots taking today + tomorrow as a vacation was out to see me. I have felt some better today but still my stomach is on the bum.

JANUARY 1931

Thursday 8 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>45</sup> AM 2<sup>10</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Received my house coat today + it is a perfect fit. Mr + Mrs Sam Adams are on duty tonight, Mrs Mason is sick and "Ted" at home waiting for?!. (7th girl.)

Friday 9 2<sup>15</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> AM 1<sup>20</sup>, 6<sup>10</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

There has been no let up in the weather conditions this week. I almost choke at times, wish it would turn cold or go on and rain and not be so foggy.

Saturday 10 1<sup>20</sup>, 6<sup>40</sup> AM 3<sup>00</sup>, 7<sup>40</sup>, 11<sup>45</sup>

My cold continues to hang on. Got a hair cut, bath and did not put on my heavy underwear afterward. I expect that will help my cold get worse, but it was hot to wear it.

Memoranda Toots worked her last day for the L. + N. today. I am sorta glad because she can take a little rest now and not think she will lose a day's pay.

JANUARY 1931

Sunday 11 4<sup>45</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>10</sup> 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Eddie Beam was out visiting us old lungers. He feels he never was one and looks it too. Toots was here but she had the blues over her job.

Monday 12 2<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>40</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>00</sup> 10<sup>00</sup>

Tuesday 13 2<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>45</sup> AM 3<sup>20</sup> 8<sup>45</sup> PM

If the weather continues to get much colder I fear I will have to return to my heavy undies again for comfort.

Wednesday 14 1<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>45</sup> AM 4<sup>00</sup> + 8<sup>45</sup> PM

Toots was out to see me and brought me two suits of pajamas and a walking cane. I am glad it is so she can come out more for just a little while,

JANUARY 1931 66

Grenville Walters was discharged today and that leaves me to shave myself. The weather I spoke of has all gone into a fog and an attempt to rain.

Friday 16 2<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>00</sup> AM 12<sup>00</sup> 6<sup>00</sup> 10<sup>30</sup>

Shaved myself this morning. It is somewhat of a job after having someone else party to do it for you for over a year. It is up to me to do it now or else join the house of David. There is no barber here.

Saturday 17 2<sup>10</sup> 6<sup>30</sup> AM 12<sup>15</sup> 6<sup>00</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup>

If all this fog don't pretty soon take a leave of absence some body about like me will pass out. At times I can hardly get my breath especially when I take a coughing spell.

Toots was here even though it is a bad day she was sorta in the dumps when she left because I said if she did not find a job it would be soon enough, she has taken care of the family long enough.

Monday 19 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> AM 3<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup>

P.E. Lee's Birthday, open house. Rev. Eakin former pastor of Henderson Methodist Church visited me. He was giving communion.

Tuesday 20 5<sup>00</sup> AM 1<sup>30</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Wednesday 21 2<sup>30</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> AM 1<sup>30</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup>

Toots was out today, brought me some homemade candy. I gave her the wristband I had ordered for her as a birthday present. Got my little green alarm clock today.

JANUARY 1931

Thursday 22 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> AM 1<sup>00</sup>, 5<sup>45</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup>

I have felt strictly on the burn today. Spit just a little blood this morning when I first got up but it soon stopped - just what that means I know but just hate to say.

Friday 23 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> 11<sup>00</sup> AM 1<sup>30</sup> + 8<sup>50</sup> PM

Coughed a lot today, and felt burn all around every way. I wish I could once get started right again. The weather is not so good either.

Saturday 24 2<sup>00</sup>, 8<sup>45</sup> AM 3<sup>30</sup> + 8<sup>40</sup>

I continue to feel sorta burn but have not noticed any blood in my sputum for a day or two. Almost like a real spring day, sun bright but a little cool.

Sunday 25 <sup>116</sup> 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> AM 11<sup>15</sup> AM 3<sup>45</sup> + 8<sup>30</sup> PM

Wrote a letter to Mr Charles W. Weil this AM.  
Toots brought me my supper and it sure tasted good. M.D. is on the sick list. We don't know the trouble she says she just "don't feel good."

Monday 26 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>45</sup> AM 11<sup>10</sup> AM 3<sup>45</sup> + 6<sup>45</sup> PM

Started taking the Alpine camp today. Toots called Miss Fitzgibbons and asked her to tell me that Martha Lilly was all broke out with the measles. That is why she has been sick.

Tuesday 27 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>45</sup> AM 11<sup>10</sup> AM 5<sup>30</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup> PM

They changed from City water to the Well water today. The City water has such a bad odor and taste caused from dead fish in the river and the drought. Wrote F. J. Hashin some questions.

Wednesday 28 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup>, 5<sup>45</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Toots was out to see me again. I don't know but it seems to me that things don't go as smooth as they once did between us. There is a difference. The mistake has been made. It's late now.

JANUARY 1931

Thursday 29 3<sup>45</sup>, 11<sup>15</sup> AM 4<sup>15</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Aunt Fannie Brock died this AM. she was the last member of the family. It all seems so funny how soon the family ties can be broken and all the members pass on beyond.

Friday 30 4<sup>30</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> AM 1<sup>30</sup>, 6<sup>30</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Aunt Fannie buried 2<sup>30</sup> PM at S.M. Had "Death" to call home for me to see how Marthavilly and Mmeselle were getting along. Reported fine.

Saturday 31 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>40</sup> AM 1<sup>30</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> + 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Nothing unusual except that it is the last day of January 1931 and instead of my not using codeine as much I have used it more.

Received a nice box of candy from aunt Sister + Salibelle.

Looks more like it might rain than it has for months. In fact it is raining just a little at bed times. We sure need rain. The drought is getting serious in these parts.

Tuesday 10 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> AM 4<sup>15</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Had a little shakeup in the nursing force today. Mrs. Croan moved to the 4<sup>th</sup> floor and two new nurses are now with us. I don't know their names. Wrote the bank tonight.

Wednesday 11 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>15</sup> AM 12<sup>45</sup>, 5<sup>45</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup>

Not much news, I missed having Toots as a visitor today. 110 pounds heavy this morning.

FEBRUARY 1931

Thursday 12 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>15</sup> AM 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>20</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Open house all day but I did not have any visitors at all.

I sure am putting in good time coughing these days. My throat seems to be bothering me quite a bit these days.

The light over my door went out. New Bulb.

Monday 16 <sup>100</sup> 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> AM, 8<sup>30</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup> PM

Napoleon Gilbert took Pneumolysis operation this AM, almost 2 hours. He went through it in good shape and seems it will be quite a success.

Tuesday 17 <sup>100</sup> 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup> AM, 1<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup>

Well, for a change it has rained most all day, not hard but just a drizzle. Through some sort of argument all "Special Trays" have to be carried by the messes now.

Wednesday 18 <sup>100</sup> 2<sup>00</sup>, 6<sup>15</sup> AM, 12<sup>30</sup>, 6<sup>00</sup>, 10<sup>00</sup>

I don't know how long it is going to continue but since the nurses are bringing my tray to me it seems it reaches me is a lot better fix. Not half as messed up as before.

My temp. seems to have taken a sort of climbing motion I thought for a week or so it was going to come on down like it should but I can't expect to much. M.L. has been as usual.

Wednesday 15, 112, 1100, 420, 900

I have had more temp. today than for over a month. Wrote Dr. Fisher at Waverley Hills, Ky.

My temp. has been still higher this afternoon 102.4 highest I know. The weather sure is hot that is one reason because you can't be quiet.

Toots come down tonight at 845 got home 1015. It has come to the place that I don't know what to do just at 1200 midnight I almost had a real hemorrhage. Now whether to do a Memoranda go back to Waverley Hills or try to stay here a while longer. Well, I think it best to go back to old Waverley Hills. Toots is to call Dr. Brock tonight and let me know when to come I wish I was there now.
