Acknowledged have bargained, Exchanged, Alien'd, & Con-  
firmed and do by these presents, bargain, Exchange, alien  
and confirm unto the said Ingram his, heirs, and assigns  
forever a certain Negroe Woman named Hannah  
and her female child nam<sup>d</sup> Malinda and their Increase  
to have and to hold unto the said Ingram, his heirs, and  
assigns, the said Negroes in fe Simple, & I do  
hereby bind myself, my heirs, Ex<sup>rs</sup> and Adm<sup>rs</sup> to  
warrant and forever defend the said Negroes and their  
increase unto the said Ingram his heirs and assigns  
against the claim or Title of all and every person  
or persons whatsoever Legally claiming the same, In  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
seal this 6<sup>th</sup> day of October Anno Domini 1804

iah Ingram and his heirs forever to have and to hold the  
said Negro free from the Claims of the said William  
Willis and his heirs in witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and seal this second Day of June Eighteen  
hundred and five. { Entered before me }

heirs & Assigns the sd Negroes in fee simple & I do hereby  
bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators warrant &  
defend the sd Negroes & their Increase unto the sd Ingham  
his heirs & Assigns Against the Claim or title of all  
& Every person or persons whatsoever legally Claiming  
the same in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
& seal this <sup>21<sup>st</sup></sup> July ~~Day of November~~ 1805

of Kentucky both this Day Bargained Sold and  
Confirmed and by these presence both bargained and  
and confirm unto Jeremiah Ingram of the County  
and State aforesaid one Negro Boy named  
Eli Slave for life aged ten years for and  
in consideration of Six hundred Dollars to me in  
hand paid by the said Ingram a receipt of  
which is hereby acknowledged and further I  
the said Willis both warrant and defend  
the title of said negro Eli to said Ingram  
and his heirs for ever against the claim or  
claims of all other persons whatsoever as witness  
my hand and seal this 15th Day of September 1818
