

J. Red was in the service went to South America, died, left son Wallace & Henry, a daughter who died without issue.

Priscilla Warner, wife of Warner, widow of J. Red resides near Dover on Canal James Red. rec^d from estate \$4850.

Wallace paid by decree of Court at Pitt. \$2900 to Henry Red adm^r of James Red of Ireland. J. Selden of Wash or all the money from BK. This was in the nature of a final decree & release of Wallace j^r as Ex^r of Red's estate by operation of law as Ex^r of Geo. Wallace est. who was Ex^r of Henry Red. The Legats of Red, were in addition to the \$2900 entitled to all the benefits & property belonging to said Estate & shortly, this closing about \$1100. Say \$1092.10. Came in aft^r to Mrs. Wallace (near Mrs. Cotton) as Ex^r of Geo. Wallace j^r which was collected on a debt due to Henry Red's Estate by Mess^{rs} Reynolds and Farady, attys at Law at Wash as Mr. Thaw informs me he was formerly clerk in BK. did the same for Mrs. Wallace, resides near Allegheny at house.

Old Mr. Wallace died in 1811.

 1793 that he contracted with her ^{to build the house} husband at the

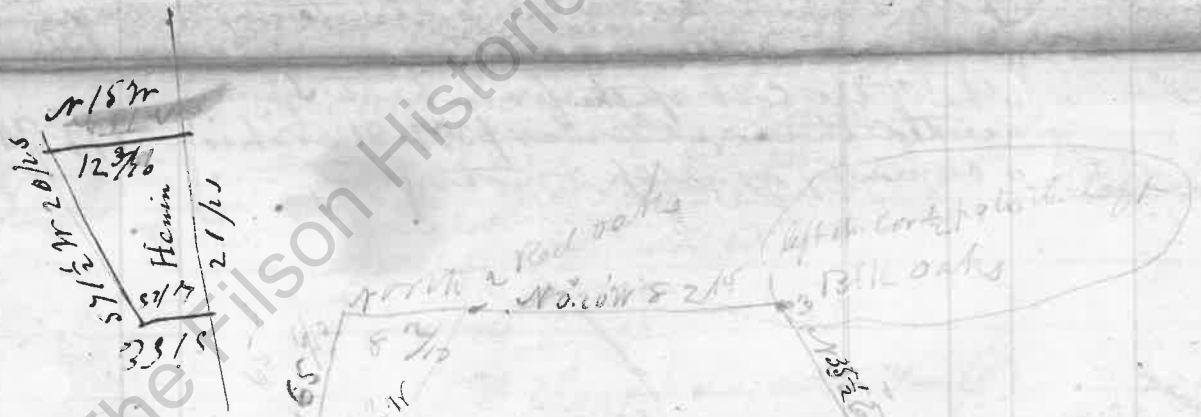

Take this deed McMillan to Rymer 27th Nov. 1795, reciting the previous sale to Henry Reid, the nominal consideration of \$2. showing clearly the sale to H. Reid was the inducement to McMillan to convey. Tho. the Scriber qualifies it, by saying "and by special order from the trustees of the said Reid" where are they? there were no trustees, much less Ex^{rs} or adm^{rs}. then competent to convey lands in Ohio, or out of the County of Phil^a. were probate was granted Ex^{rs} Letch without security. Take also the Memor^{um} or obligation signed by Henry Reid to improve, and save for future, dated the day of 1790 or 91 filed in the cause. Letch, the deposition of Caldwell & Foster, that he built or kept a store on that lot from '90 to 3 or 4 years subsequent. The writing entered into by McMillan, as a contract with other persons for other parts of the adjoining grounds, in 1794 recognizing & calling for the line of the ground of Henry Reid's heirs, all these facts & circumstances, will dispel the necessity of shewing by extraneous proof that McMillan sold the ground to H. Reid, because he recognizes in the writings, & all the papers sheweth. He had a right to receive title from Henry Reid, because without it he could not comply with his contract to convey to H. Reid and conveying to Rymer in the manner he did! he only conveyed to him in truth for H. Reid's H^{rs} & the court would so have construed it, if they had not permitted the hasty sketch to be filed, by way of deceit, perjury of course they never ordered, but allowed or permitted.
