No. 1 Take of Colombo root 1 dr.; Cascarella 1 dr.; buse and infuse in boiling water, 10 ojs.; Strain when cold, and add quinine 1 dr.; diluted Sulphuric acid, 50 drops. Mix, one table Spoon to be taken every six hours.
No. 2 Take of quassia raspings, 1 dr.; orange peel 3 drs. infuse in boiling water 10 ojs.; Strain and add trichine of the muriate of iron 2 drs. Mix. A table Spoon every 6 hours.

No. 3 Take of precipitated Carbonate of iron, 2 drs Carbonate of Soda 1 dr.; ginger powder 1 ~~dr~~ scr. Mix, and divide into 12 powders. One to be taken every six hours.
Stricture of The Rectum - It often proceeds from costiveness, and hardened feces, which excoriate the parts in passing down the rectum; also by drastic purges, piles, &c. The rectum becomes partially or nearly closed by tumors or Scirrhus which renders evacuations very painful, except the feces are in a very liquid state.

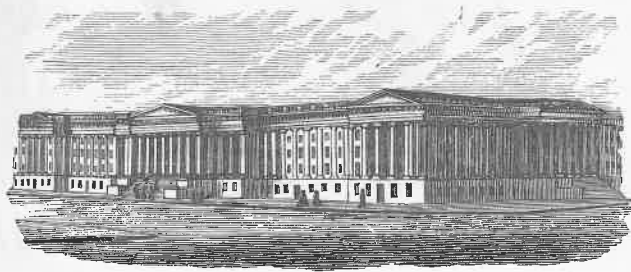

Improvement in *Rollers.*

We have made a careful examination in the United States Patent Office, in relation to your invention, and have to report that we find a substantial anticipation thereof in the patent, No. 158,012, issued to W. W. Anderson, of Wartrace, Tenn. Dec. 22/74, of which we annex a sketch.

This case shows a frame in which run two rollers, B, B, in front of and between which cross bars carry cutters D, D. Each roller is provided with a scraper in its end extending from side to side.

In view of the above, we regret to have to report that we can discover nothing patentable in your invention.
