I certify, on honor, that on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1862, at Oak Hill Ohio the Cavalry and Garrison Equipage enumerated below was dropped under the following circumstances,

A portion of the Equipage carried by the enlisted of my company, D, of the 49<sup>th</sup> Regt Ind, Vol, Inf., being worn out and worthless, and the Regt being then under marching orders, I was directed by the Col<sup>d</sup> Commanding Regt "to throw away all the Camp and Garrison Equipage unfit for further use and drag from the Quartermaster a new supply to replace that thrown away. At that time it was impossible for me to comply <sup>with</sup> as 1033 Revised Army Reg 1841, and have the property condemned by an inspecting Officer. The order to drop the property was verbal and it is impossible for me to obtain a copy of the same. Below is a list of property dropped.

## Suggestions to Officers having unserviceable Stores on Hand.

A few timely repairs may often save the expense of a new outfit, and avoid delays which may endanger an entire command.

Hence, whenever stores become unserviceable, from any cause whatever, it becomes the duty of the Officer responsible for them to put them in order with the means at his disposal.

In the case of Ordnance Stores which need much labor to make them serviceable, they should at once be sent to the nearest Arsenal or Ordnance Depot.

No officer should ever permit himself to be encumbered with material which he cannot use, but which the regulations continue to hold him responsible for. He should dispose of it at the earliest moment, as prescribed by the usages of service.

In all cases where a company commander has unserviceable stores to account for, he should make a request through the commanding officer of the Regiment for an inspection of the stores in his possession by a duly authorized Inspector. Pending the result of this application, he should have the stores collected, the repairable separated from those worn out or worthless, and an inventory, in triplicate, taken of the whole on the accompanying form, which he duly signs.

On the completion of the inspection, the triplicate inspection reports will be signed by the inspecting officer, and transmitted by him to the Chief of the Staff Department to which the property pertains, who will communicate the action of the Major General Commanding (par. III, General Orders No. 3, Headquarters, Department of the Gulf, 1863); upon being so approved, the three copies will be returned to the officer accountable for the stores—one to be retained by him, one to accompany his accounts, and one to be forwarded, through superior Headquarters, to the Chief of the Staff Department to which the property belongs.

The immediate commander can order the final disposition of condemned property, in the case of horses which should be killed at once to prevent contagion, or of provisions, or other stores, which are rapidly deteriorating (par. 1023 Army Regulations).
