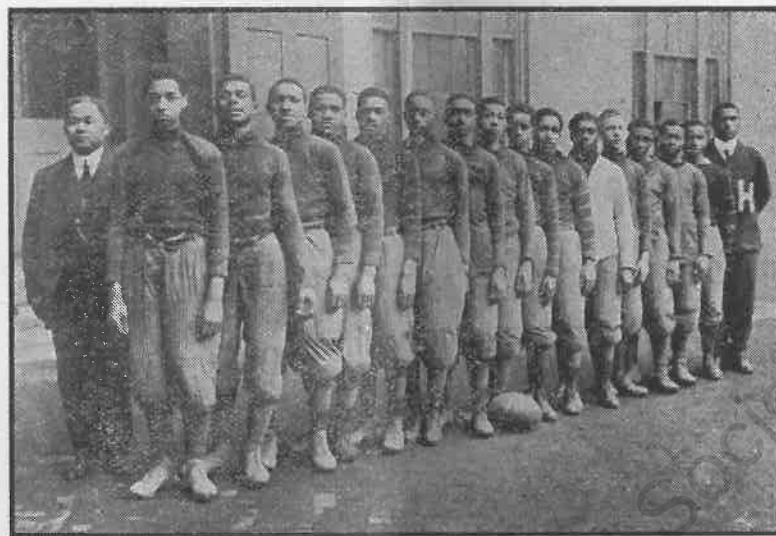

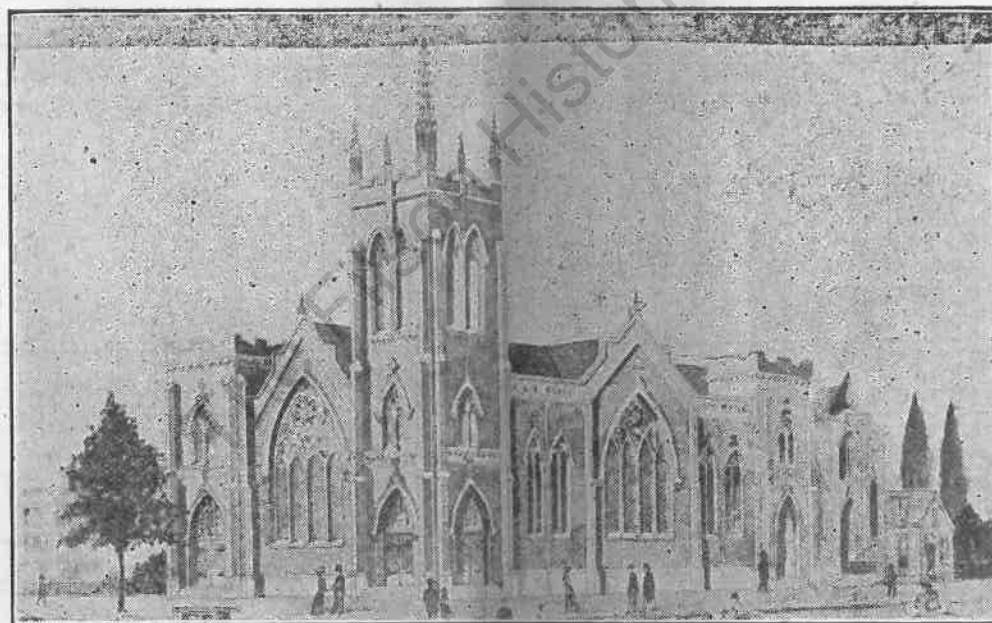

CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL FOOT BALL TEAM



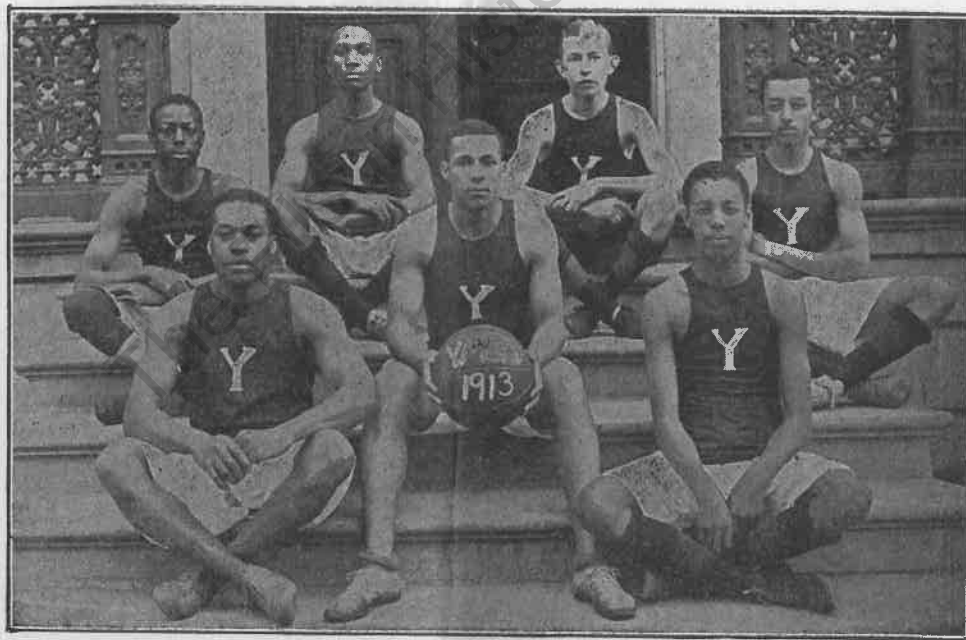
