Know all men by these presents That I Thomas  
Buckner of the county of Jefferson & State of Ken-  
tucky do give up, all my right title & interest  
and claim that I have, or might or could  
have by virtue of a contract entered into  
between my self & Robert Buckner by two  
Negroes now in the possession of the  
City of Louisville one of them the name  
the Other Anthony which two Negroes were  
formerly purchased of Richard L. Murray  
then, it is agreed on & fairly understood  
that I am not to be liable in any manner  
what ever for or on account of said neg-  
ros whether they are recovered of the said  
Murray or not - as I do not receive any com-  
pensation for the same in witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand & seal  
this 17th day of October 1822

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Know all men by these presents that I Richard & Meriwether  
withes of the County of Jefferson State of Kentucky for  
and in consideration of the sum of five hundred  
dollars to me in hand paid by Robert Buckner in cash  
named Peggy <sup>named Peggy</sup> women, and fifty dollars worth of Provisions and  
forty dollars in cash the Tit whereof I do hereby acknowledge  
to be the Bargained for of the said Richard and  
Meriwether presents with great Bargain do hereby  
Deliver unto the said Robert Buckner and his heirs  
for ever a Negro man named Simon about twenty  
five years of age which negro I drew I was attested  
me from the State of my D<sup>d</sup> Father James Meriwether  
withes to have I do hold the said Negro man Simon  
on unto the said Robert Buckner his heirs as a slave  
for life & the said Richard & Meriwether for  
my self my heirs & assigns shall and will for ever war-  
rant & defend the title of the said Negro unto  
to the said Robert Buckner his heirs against  
the claim or claims of all & every other person or  
persons whatever in witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & seal this 3<sup>th</sup> day of  
January 1820 —

McCallum now of the City of Louisville  
have sold to Robert Buckner also of the  
City of Louisville five Negro Slaves  
viz Rachel about thirty two years of age  
and her four children with friends  
about eleven years of age about  
eight years old about  
six years old and Martha Jane  
about six months old for the sum  
of one thousand six hundred  
dollars to us in hand paid the  
Receipt whereof we James McCallum  
& Benjamin F. Booker doth hereby  
acknowledge and have hereby sold  
and delivered the same unto the  
said Robert Buckner for use  
and we will & do hereby warrant  
& defend the Right and Title of  
said negroes to the said Robert  
Buckner
