old when the Civil War started. She was born Sept. 20, 1848.

guerilla Captain Davison but not his men he said he was coming
in the next day and burn the jail and courthouse but he did not
come.

Two companies of rebels come in town under command of Capt. Horsely
and Webster. Three of them got drunk and went into Mr. Inman's
and broke two chairs and threwed them out in the street. Then
the captain came back and threatened to shoot Wood Malin but the
people all told him that his own men broke open the barroom door
and got the whiskey so he got down and poured all of the whiskey
out and let it run in the street. Two of the rebels when they
got drunk went into Mr. Inman's store with their horses.

Sept. 20th 1862

Ben could have been either son of Blanchert and Sallie Neafus
Shacklett, grand son of General Blant Shacklett, whose brother
Richard was with Morgan's men, This Ben born Apr.2,1842 m 1866
Susan Townsend; or Ben W. Shacklett b Nov.26, 1837 son of
Absalom and Sarah Taylor Hayden Shacklett, grandson of Gen.Ben
Shacklett. This Ben married 1869 Eliza Tuell.

(Jess Taylor was a lawyer in Brandenburg, b 1823 married Sophia
Harlan. He had a son,Jesse, but was he old enough to be in
this war ?)

There were a band of thieves crossed Ohio River July 8, 1863.
It was Morgan's band.

The Unions came July 9th 1863 crossed the river and chased them
into Ohio there they had to surrender July the 1863.Good for them.

(Perrin's History pages 456-457 459-460.)

The guerrillas came in Friday morning October 14th 1864 under
the command of Capt. Steele and they robbed the town his name
just suits him he broke up all of the Home Guards guns at the
Masonic Hall.

Tuesday October 18th 1864 there were more rebels came in under
the command of Major Harris & Capt. Erown they did not touch a
thing.

But the home guards were over the river and they fired on to this
side all day Wednesday after they were all gone away.

There were some guerrillas came in today under the command of
Walker Taylor Nov. 29th 1864

There were a band of Union robbers came in today and robbed the
town they took my comfort and ~~gixxxx~~ my gloves I think they
were pushed. Nov. 23, 1864. Wednesday it was These robbers
wounded Ike Malin.

Walker Taylor b Feb.1846 son of John H. and Hannah Shacklett
Taylor. He married Elizabeth Shacklett, dau. of Gen. Ben Shacklett.)

Ike Malin , there were two- one b 1813, father of Sanford Malin
and a younger Ike, b 1828 son of Basil B. and Ann Malin. This Ike
had a brother Woodford and a sister Eliza who was John Frakes'
first wife. It would seem to be the younger man.)

Sim Horsely came in with his company Monday Nov. 14th 1864 and did not touch a thing.

He came again Friday 18th of Nov. and pressed a few things
He came on Friday the 25th 1864 He came in again Sunday 28th 1864 but did not take a thing only pressed some horses.

Mr. Smith and another of Mr. Horsely's men came in Monday and Nov. 28 Mr. Smith bowed to Ella Fontaine and I and asked us if there were any Yankees in town & we told him no & Ella said none at all without you are them.

Mr. Smith is dead now Mr. Horsely's men wounded him and then he died poor fellow

Dec. 3th 1864

Sim Horsely's men came in New Years day and they tried to capture the boat but they could not quite come it The boat had 15 Union soldiers on it and they fired into the rebels and wounded one of their horses but it died shortly afterwards.

Jan. 1, 1865

Capt. Horsely's men have been coming in every day.

I have had a fine time all this week Sunday night Mrs. Bickerstaff gives us a supper. Tuesday we went into Mrs. Kay's and had a fine time a singing.
Monday or Thursday we did not have no fun.

Friday we went over to Mrs. Kays we all throwed in some money and bought us some sugar and made us some candy. Mr. and Mrs. Bickerstaff were there when we got through with the candy we dressed up and had a plenty of fun.

Saturday we had an oyster supper over to Mr. Bickerstaff's and had a little more fun.

This has been a very nice Christmas. Dec. 31th 1864.
