Mr John Sutton as principal and
 W Field Security three months after
 date promise to pay to Brooke Hill Thirteen
 Dollars & Thirty two Cents with interest from
 the date hereof being the purchase money
 of Books belonging to said Company. This
 debt sold by Mr Field Sheriff of Jefferson County
 in satisfaction of an execution from the
 Clerk's Office of the Jefferson Circuit Court
 on the 22nd July 1828 in favor of said Brooke
 Hill against said Library Company for
 one hundred & thirty dollars debt with
 interest & cost then under our hands
 and Seals the 3rd day of Sept 1828.
