Dear Ms. Oliver:

When I was at The Filson Club on Jul. 18, a docent gave me your name.

I have ^{searched} my family lines (now 51 that I know of) since 1960. One line with Kentucky connections ai FAUTENBURY. This name appears in print in a small booklet, " Miller Family Lineage." Enclosed is a complete copy of this booklet. Author is unknown; date about 1961. (I am descended from John LANDESS.) I am well aware of variations in spelling names. My problem is that I cannot find a name in Kentucky even close to FAUTENBURY.

Timewise, Lydia FAUTENBURY was born ca 1740, in Wilkes Co. ?, NC, Married ca 1760 in KY ? (no MR found in NC). Lived in Henderson Co. ?, KY.

Enclosed is a summary of sources checked and to check; list of names sort of like FAUTENBURY; 4 pages of notes from sources; working list of censuses searched (printed censuses).

Have you run across the name, FAUTENBURY, in KY ? Any suggestions on what this name probably is ?

MILLER FAMILY LINEAGE

Lydia Fautenbury

The Fautenbury family, originally from England, about 1738, came from North Carolina to Kentucky at a very early date, possibly 1750. The entire family except a daughter named *Lydia* was killed by the Indians; she saved her life by crawling into an old brick oven and was reared by a neighboring family. She married a man by the name of Reynolds (sometimes found as "Runnells"). This couple had a large family but the one we are interested in was *Mary*, who married *Jacob Landess* about 1780 and had 10 children:

and *SUSANNA*—(born April 19, 1802; died April 27, 1893.)

Susanna married *Morris King*, in 1820, the second, and died at Lynchburg, Ohio, April 27, 1893. She is buried beside her husband in the Barr Cemetery near Pricetown, Ohio, in Highland County.

Morris King was born December 6, 1795, probably somewhere in New Jersey. Little is really known about his parentage but he had four sisters (or half sisters, *Sarah Harris*, *Margaret Scott*, *Rebecca Chapman* and *Betty Couch*, and a *Polly Davidson* comes in somewhere).

Family "tradition" gives this about the parentage of *Morris King*:

Morris King I born about 1715.

His son . . . King born about 1745, presumed his name *William*.

His son *William King* born about 1770. of the first *William*)

His son *Morris King* born Dec. 6, 1795. of the second *William*).

Morris King I born about 1715, an only son

with five sisters, was a strict churchman of the Dunkard faith.

Morris King 2nd, (great grandson of Morris King I) mother was from a wealthy Swiss family and of the Presbyterian faith. The sister of Morris King's grandfather whose name was presumed to be William (see above) married Aason Burr and eventually settled in Ohio. (Possibly tradition).

To this union of Morris King 2nd and Susanna Landess were born fourteen children, the oldest Jane, died at birth:

Mary remained in Ohio. *Rebecca* eventually settled in *Des Moines, Iowa*. *William* buried in *Fairfield, Iowa*. *Henry* went to *Pringhar, Iowa*. *Huldah* remained in Ohio. *John King*
Margaret King (married *Stevens*) remained in Ohio. She was one of the original group that formed the W.C.T.U. at *Hillsboro, Ohio*—and they were called the "Crusaders".

Allen King buried in *Fairfield, Iowa*. *Eliza* remained in Ohio; *Sarah* in *Marion, Indiana*; *Robert* in Ohio; *Perry* in *Fairfield, Iowa*; *Gelina* in *Marion, Indiana*.

Morris King 2nd died May 4, 1851, 56 years old and *Susanna* lived 42 years a widow and reared thirteen children "to marry".

MILLER

Rebecca King, the third child of *Susanna Landess* and *Morris King 2nd*, was married to *Isaac Newton Miller* on March 3, 1840 in *Highland County, Ohio*.

Isaac Miller was born January 4, 1818 in Ohio. No one knows about his parentage. He was a "non-conformer" or perhaps one should

say a "true pioneer", always pushing west in his *Conestoga*, when "settlements" became rather populated. In 1849 before the 5th child, *Sarah*, was born, they left southern Ohio and went to *Indiana*; they made one trip back to *Highland County, Ohio*, about 1853; returned after a few weeks to *Indiana* and from there moved to northern *Missouri* and then to southeastern *Iowa*. He was a southern sympathizer and an ardent foe of war. He was from a Quaker family, religiously inclined, and a conscientious objector, so therefore was most unpopular in many places. He maneuvered it so that his two boys, *James* and *Eli*, who should have been in the struggle, did not go. Perhaps that was the reason he moved so constantly in the 1860s. He was shot (while living in *Missouri*) in the leg, by what was then termed "bush-whackers".

At last they left southeastern *Iowa* and started west, destination unknown. They arrived in *Des Moines, Iowa*, in early 1865 when *Court Avenue* was the main street with one dry goods store. After spending several weeks looking the settlement over, he decided it was already too thickly populated and prepared to push on. They were on their way out of *Des Moines*, when *Rebecca King Miller* decided she was tired of moving, so she spoke her mind in such tones and words that after a half hour *Isaac N. Miller* pulled the mules to a stop and fervently declared to the Almighty and *Rebecca* that he would stay in this place the rest of his life. At that time they were in front of a hotel-tavern where the stage enroute to *Winterset* and *Indianola* stopped (there were no railroads at that time) and without saying another word, he went in and purchased the hotel and they operated it for several years (about 15). When they sold, they bought a small farm on *Southwest 9th St.* about half way from the then city and the now *Army Post*. The location is the southeast corner of *S. W. 9th* and *McKinley Avenue*. (The house they built was moved back in 1958 and used as a storehouse for a

supermarket).

JAMES MILLER (son of Isaac) sat on a horse on Third Street, Des Moines and watched the first train come into Des Moines. He also worked on the State Capitol laying the gold on the large dome. He was a staunch member of the IOOF Lodge and was the first grand master of the Bondurant group, which at that time (1891 or 1892) was very active. He voted the Democratic ticket every year but one, and that was when Teddy Roosevelt ran on the "Bull Moose" ticket. Woodrow Wilson was too idealistic to suit his practical ideas.

This couple (Isaac N. Miller and Rebecca King Miller) had 12 children and eight lived to "marry".

Esther Jane, Dec. 11, 1842; died 1912? *William H.*, 1843-1844; *James Alexander*, Sept. 5, 1845, died 1935; *Eli J.*, 1847-1902; *Harvey Sylvester*, 1851-1918; *Margareta*, 1854; *Nancy Ellen*, 1856; *Albert Perry*, 1859-1860; *Theopolis*, 1860-1904; *Isaac N.*, 1864-about 1872; *Olive R.*, 1870-died about 1939.

Isaac Newton Miller died about 1889 and Rebecca King Miller passed away April 9, 1911. They are buried in _____

JAMES ALEXANDER MILLER — (Your grandfather (Lowell, Leland, Claire, Irma and Max) and your children's great-grandfather (Shirley, Janet, Leland Jr., Carol, George, Robert, Robert Bernell, Elizabeth Christine, Mary Kathleen, David.) Born Sept. 5, 1845, in Highland County, Ohio, was married to *Angeline Copper* on Aug. 14, 1869 and to this union was born four children:

Harvey Sylvester, Dec. 19, 1870, at Des Moines, Iowa—Died June 20, 1939.

Mary Rebecca, Sept. 5, 1872, at Des Moines, Iowa—Died Jan. 15, 1957.

Ida May, May 2, 1873, at Des Moines, Iowa—Died Feb. 15, 1950.

James Ernest, June 14, 1876, At Des Moines,

Iowa—Died April 28, 1927.

Angeline Copper Miller died November 2, 1878, in Salina, Kansas, where the family had gone in 1877, and is buried there.

The four children of this union lived "to marry."

Harvey S. married *Elizabeth Christine Iseminger*, Sept. 23, 1894 and had five children—James Lowell, Leland Kenneth, Claire Iseminger, Irma Geneva and Max Bernell. (More information about the Harvey S. Miller family later).

Mary Rebecca married *Augustus (Gus) L. Sumner* Dec. 11, 1898. No children.

Ida May married *Frank E. Harris* Nov. 18, 1895. Had one son, Glea Olland, who died in 1909—13 years of age. These two families are buried in Glendale Cemetery, Des Moines, Iowa.

Ernest James Miller was married to *Frances M. Mitchell*, Dec. 15, 1897 and had two children—a girl, Bernice Marita, a son, Emmet James. Bernice married Elmer H. Clifford and had two sons, Donald and Laverne and a daughter, Marita Mae. These children have families. Emmet and his wife, Mildred, had twin sons, Emmet James and Stewart Wesley. Ernest and Emmet are buried in the cemetery at Sipirt Lake, Iowa.

On Dec. 24, 1880, James A. Miller was married to *Isabel Ruama Brown*. She was a niece of Angeline Copper, his first wife. Her mother was the oldest daughter in the John and Mary Copper family, while Angeline was the youngest daughter of John and Mary Copper.

James A. Miller and *Isabel Ruama Brown Miller* had four children:

Nellie Edna, born Feb. 15, 1882—Died July 27, 1953.

Amos Isaac, born Jan. 4, 1884—Died April 17, 1950.

Louie Virgie, born April 26, 1889.

Carl Emmet, born August 22, 1891.
Isabel Miller died Sept. 28, 1917. James Miller died October 31, 1935.

Both are buried in the cemetery at Bondurant, Iowa, where Edna and Amos are buried and where Louie expects to be.

Isabel Miller was a kind, gentle woman and reared the family of eight in such a way, there seemed to be no division in any way. She once said of her son (Harvey) (she never allowed anyone to say "stepchild") that Harvey had never given her a cross look or word. It was my pleasure to tell him she had said this to me (Louie) just a few weeks before she passed on while visiting at the home of Ernest Miller in northern Iowa. All the eight children were present at the funeral.

Regarding the death of Angeline Copper Miller—they had a cow staked out on their claim in Salina County and when it broke loose, she, knowing how much her little family depended on it, made an effort to catch the rope. She became entangled in the rope and was thrown. She was pregnant and lived about two days after her fall. When she passed on in one corner of the sod house, James Miller's sister, Margaret Miller Borton, gave birth in the same hour in another corner of the house to her second daughter, Laura, who is now Mrs. John McMickeal of Eugene, Oregon. She and her husband have been married 60 some years.

The following four are the children of Isabelle Brown Miller, niece of Angeline Copper.

Edna Miller family—

Nellie Edna Miller married Edward Dennis Stewart and had one son, Cleo Edward Stewart who married Clara Youngquist. They had one daughter, Marilyn Dorothy Stewart who married Thomas Lorenz. The Lorenz family have three sons, Raymond, Cary and Thomas.

Both are buried in Portland, Oregon in the cemetery near Oswego, Oregon.

James Lowell Miller, born Dec. 15, 1896 in Bondurant, Iowa. Died at San Jose, Calif., May 16, 1959 and is buried at Oak Hill in San Jose.

Leland Kenneth Miller, born Sept. 7, 1900 at Kalispell, Mont. (Irma says Bondurant, Iowa, but Lowell always said Kalispell and George Miller, Lee's son, said that Isabelle Miller and her mother, Mrs. Clarke, said Kalispell). Leland died Feb. 14, 1953 at his ranch at Murtaugh, Idaho (near Twin Falls).

Claire Iseminger Miller, born Nov. 18, 1904 at Kalispell, Mont. Now living at 1425 24th Avenue, Longview, Washington.

Irma Geneva Miller, born Sept. 28, 1908 at Kalispell, Montana, now living at 821 6th St., Santa Monica, California.

Max Bernell Miller, born Nov. 27, 1910 at Kalispell, Mont. Died at Twin Falls, Idaho, May 22, 1961 and is buried at Shoshone, Idaho.
