The Filson Historical Society likes to collect important things related to local history. One thing that we have gathered a lot of are


maps. We have over 1,150 maps in our collections.






Abraham Lincoln was the 16th President of the United States of America. He was born on February 12, 1809 in Hodgenville, KY.


