Dear Mrs. Slocum:

The original marriage records of Logan County will be found in that county. Some court houses do not have the facilities for photostating records and in this situation certified copies of records must suffice. Some of the early marriage bonds have been lost in some Kentucky counties. I do not know if those of Logan County are intact.

We have so few Logan County records that I am unable to give you any real assistance in your research on Thomas Clark and Polly Anthony. The 1800 Kentucky Tax List places Joseph Anthony in Warren County and Adam and Philip Anthony in Nelson County. In looking through early Logan County wills I find Philip Anthony as the Administrator of the estate of Fred. Groves on April 13, 1807.

I suggest that you write Mrs. Wells Vick, Russellville, Kentucky. She is actively engaged in genealogical research in Logan County and may be able to help you. I am certain that some one will have to examine the court records for clues or answers to your problem.

As our staff is small we do not have the time to devote to extensive genealogical research but we are always glad to answer two or three questions if the information is easily found. I enclose one of our little brochures which will tell you something about the Filson Club.

Dear Mrs. Hatton:

The few references we have in our library pertaining to your family use consistently the spelling Anthony. The 1800 census records do use the spelling of Anthony but I feel the variation was due to the notation of the census-taker. You will find many instances of name variations. The result can be very confusing and misleading.

Although I did not find any mention of William or Martin Anthony, directly, in the History of Muhlenberg County, by Otto Rothert refers briefly to the following Anthons: William, member of the court in 1859; William L., publisher of the first weekly newspaper in the county in 1870; Susan M., one of the experienced educators of the county who taught at Prof. Green's Academy circa 1858. The name is spelled Anthony.

In the Index of the Pennsylvania Magazine there is a great deal of genealogical material on the Anthony family.

The list of Kentucky soldiers in the War of 1812 does not include any one with the name of Anthony. He may have served in another state.

I hope this information may be of some help to you.
