Dear Mrs Laker:

All these Henry Williams are confusing. It's coincidental that Henry Williams of Jefferson Co! purchased two small tracts of land on Broad Run in Jefferson Co in 1826. Abraham Eldridge bought his 245 ac on the same stream in 1855. But ~~Henry~~ ^{Henry} was a Bullitt Co resident and came to Shelby Co where he lived. I believe you are thinking along the right lines in not spending too much time on the Williams family now.

I checked the Jefferson Co. Tax List of 1845:

Abr^m Eldridge 1 white male over 21,
3 horses (\$160), 246 ac on Back
Run (\$2,000). Total \$2,100.

John B. Eldridge, 1 white male over 21,
2 horses (\$50). No land.

Walter Eldridge, 1 white male over 21,
2 horses (\$50)

Henry D. Williams, 1 white male over 21,
3 horses (\$100), 4 children 5-20.

From this, I believe (1) John B & Walter^{sr} Abraham's two sons who show on the census of 1830 or born 1810-15 and 1815-20, (2)

Henry D. Williams is the same one who left Spencer Co about 1842. He evidently went to Jefferson Co., where he lived until about 1849, then went to Indiana. His mother probably died in Jefferson Co., 1840-49.

I found a marriage record in Jefferson Co. for John B. Eldridge. He m. 1-13-1847, Mary Ann Wheeler, b. 12-24-1821, d. 3-22-1868, dau of Ignatius Wheeler. She is bur ^{in the Wheeler family plot} Kings Baptist Cem, ~~in the Wheeler~~ just over the Jefferson Co. line, in Bullitt Co. I have enclosed a sketch map showing the area where A. Eldridge lived and probably Henry D. Williams and John B. Eldridge. Many people from that area are buried at Kings Bapt Cem.

There are some cemetery records available. I have been copying ^{tombstones of} church and family burial grounds for several years. I have none on Eldridges, except the one noted above. As for history or genealogical societies, there are none with any records.

The Filson Club, which maintains some family records and a library, has nothing pertinent on either family. I am a life member and use their resources frequently.

I spent one hour in the Spencer Co. courthouse, one hour at the Jefferson Co. courthouse and one hour at the Filson Club, which is up-to-date. Fifteen dollars will cover this research.

~~mother-in-law~~ ^{probably} ~~died in Jefferson Co.~~
~~1840-50.~~ Since ^{Abraham} he and his wife do not appear on the census index of Ky in 1850, I presume they and had sold their land by 16 Mar 1847, I presume they either died or moved to another state, possibly Indiana. I would recommend a check of the 1850 indexes for Indiana and, if found there, a check of that census record. By that time, they would have been in their sixties. I can do this, if you like.

Dear Filson Club,

I have been told that your organization will place queries in your Family File and is one of the first places people go when looking for Kentucky ancestors. Please forgive me if my information is incorrect, and I hope you will answer with updated information if this is the case.

I am searching for the parents of Charles Walton Williams, born 7 Dec. 1865 in Clarksburg, KY and his brother Miles Granvil(death record spelling) Williams, born 22 April 1873 in Vanceburg, both in Lewis Co. The earliest record I have on Charles is his marriage in St. Paul, MN. on 30 Aug. 1897 to Della "Lizzie" Snyder. His birth date information comes from his death certificate and family Bible record. Charles and Della later moved to Spokane, WA. where both died. I have all pertinent records from WA. Miles moved to S. Dakota, married Marie Timmons and had no children.

The closest I have come to finding a Charles of the right age in the right place is a Charles W. Williams, age 6, in Lewis Co. 1870 census living with the Ansel Owens family. Perhaps this Owens family is a clue, but if this is my Charles why is he not with his family when they had another son 4 years later??

The 1920 census lists the family of Charles in Spokane, but in the columns for birthplace of his parents the word "unknown" is written--and then lined out!

It is believed that the name Granville figures into this family somehow as Charles named his first son Arthur Granville Williams, the same middle name of his brother, Miles.

The search for parents of these two men has gone on for years and tho I have collected as many records as I can find, and hired researchers on two separate occasions I am no closer than when I began.

Any help or suggestions will be greatly appreciated. Will pay for cost of postage and copies.

Dear Mr. Jobson,

I'm sorry that I didn't answer your first letter right away. I should of sent you a post card telling you of my intentions. I was asked by a friend to visit the Indiana State Library & delayed writing thinking that I might find additional information on the Williams & Eldridge families.

Your letter of March 19th revealed alot of new information for me. Most of the information I have was given to me by a distant cousin who is 90 years old but a very sharp mind. She knew of the location of Henry & Clarissa's tombstones & we visited the cemetery about two years ago. My information is as follows:

All children born in Ky except Theodore Carr Williams, born in Vigo Co., Ind.

Henry & Clarissa are buried at Prairie Creek Cemetery, Vigo Co., Ind.

From your information I might presume that H. & C. named Emarilla & Francis for Clarissa's sisters & perhaps Elizabeth for her Mother. Another thought, my Father was told that Theodore Carr Williams was named for a G'mother's maiden name (Carr) but of course we don't know which line.

My Father was told the Williams' came from Hardin or Nelson Co. - my elderly cousin thought Nelson. When I found the Spencer Co. marriage & a short biography on H. & C. daughter, Edna, stating her birth as Spencer Co. I knew I would need help. With so many counties formed from the original nine it gets confusing. Also, from your notes & Spencer Co. marriage records I suspect there was two Henry D. Williams' - maybe three. There were two in Vigo Co. - one a merchant & the other my Henry - a farmer. That makes searching a bit more difficult especially with a common name such as Williams.

I've been curious why H. & C. left Ky for Vigo Co., Ind. In a Vigo Co. history that contains many biographies an amazing amount of people from Spencer Co., Ky settled in Linton Twp. The 1850 census list H. & C. living two doors from Zachariah Williams (28 yrs-Farmer-BP Ky). Also, living close by was William Eldridge (57 yrs-Farmer, Minister-BP Ky). Perhaps these people were relatives. H. & C. list Ky as their birthplace. By 1860 they had moved to Sullivan Co. (Linton Twp. borders Sullivan Co.). Henry died in 1863 (too early for death records) & Clarissa in 1893. Can't find her death record in Vigo or Sullivan Co. I'm going to Sullivan this Friday to visit an Aunt in the Nursing Home & hope to do a little research too. The Sullivan Library recently acquired microfilm of old newspapers 1855-1972. Maybe that will help.

I really enjoyed reading the deeds regarding furnit^ure, etc. I like antiques and collect a little - couldn't help but wonder what price Abraham's six Windsor chairs would bring at todays prices! Looked in an old antique price guide & they quote \$2,500 apeice! I need to look your material over & digest it a little more. If I should want copies of any of the deeds or the marriage license would it be best to order them from the court house or have you do it? Some county clerks are cooperative to out of state researchers - others are not.

Let me know how much time, mileage, & postage you have spent so far so I may reimburse you. I was very pleased with your information & presentation. I do not have alot of money to spend on research but do want to pursue this a little further. Perhaps if you are doing research for someone else in Spencer Co. we could share your mileage.

Are cemetery listings available that you might check for Abraham & Elizabeth? Also, maybe a county history or local genealogy society might have something on these families. Altho, if a brief search on the Williams line doesn't show promise I may drop research on that line for a time. The fact that the name is so common makes me think I could spend alot of time & money & still have nothing. What is your opinion on this? I am open to suggestions as what methods of research to use.

I am enclosing a pedigree chart starting with my Father. If you do not need it for your files you might give it to the local genealogy society if they accept records from non-members.

It was a pleasure receiving your inquiry.

I have done some work in Spencer Co. but am not familiar with these names. I'll be happy to research the Williams and Eldridge families.

My fee is \$5.00 an hour. Just recently, I have had to request my clients to pay a mileage fee - 18 cents a mile, due to the appalling ^{increases} _{in the cost of} fuel, maintenance, and insurance. Taylorsville, the county seat of Spencer is thirty miles from here, which means \$18.80 for the round trip.

I will search wills, marriages, inventories and settlements, deeds, other court records, censuses, and tax lists. The latter two must be done from microfilm in Louisville. I will furnish photos of gravestones, dwellings or buildings, if pertinent,

and ^{map} sketches.

I hope I can be of service to you.

Henry D. Williams^{b. 1800-10} married in Spencer Co., 23 Oct 1828, Clarina Eldridge^{b. 1800-10}, dau of Abraham Eldridge. By 1830 they had a son and dau. His mother b. 1770-80 was living with them.

By 1840 he and his wife had a son b. 1835-40 and 3 daus, one b. 1825-30, one b. 1830-35 and one b. 1835-40. His mother was still living with them.

In Jan 1847 he sold farming tools, furniture, cattle, meat and tobacco to his father-in-law for \$800. He must have left Spencer Co. shortly thereafter.

ELDRIDGE

Abraham Eldridge, b. 1780-90, and his wife Elizabeth, b. 1780-90, were living in Spencer Co. in 1828, when their dau m. Henry D. Williams. In 1830 he ^{moth or mother's Creek} ~~moth or mother's Creek~~ ^{she d. 1840-50}

In Oct 1834 he sold 113ac on Simpson Creek for \$1,412.50 and removed to Jefferson Co, where, in 1835 he purchased 245ac ^{an Brook Run}. We know the names of five daughters, Clarissa, Emarilla, Caroline, Harriet, Frances. By 1847 ^{may} he had sold off all his land in Jeff Co
