

Dear Mr. Chanteraine:

Your letter of August 28th was duly received but it was sometime before I got some one to translate the notes as I do not read French at all I am so sorry to report.

Now that it is translated, I see that it will require a great deal of research to work out that family. In the firstplace you have few dates and full names. Redstone is near what is now Pittsburg and not in Kentucky, but there is a Red River in Kentucky. I have found references to a few Finns but I do not know that they will help.

In our magazine The Filson Club History Quarterly, we have published Minute Book 1 of Jefferson County, and under date of October 5, 1785, I find that Micaiah Mayfield produced sundry receipts of provisions furnished the Troops at Fort Nelson (where Louisville now stands) from James Finn purchasing Com'y wh which are thought reasonable, and ordered that the prices thereafter rated agreeable to rates fixed July 3, 1782.

In the Register of the Kentucky Historical Society, Frankfort, they published what is known as the Certificate Book but what is the findings of the count about lands in dispute. You could in the early days buy 400 acres at a low rate from the Treasury and these were Treasury Warrants on certain conditions of early settlement. After buying the 400 acres you had a preemption on 1000 acres at the same price. This book has to do with that. I find under date of November 2, 1779 at court held at Harrodsburg, James Finn testified. I also find:

"It being proved to the Court that it was proved the 3rd of November 1779 that Jas. Finn was intitled to a settlement & Preemption for residing in the Country 12 months before the year 1778 & Now Locates the same on Wilson Creek a branch of Salt River adjoining the lands of James Sam'l above ordered that a Certificate be issued accordingly.

I find in List of Revolutionary Soldiers of Virginia (Kentucky was then part of Virginia) by H.J. Eckenrode, that James Finn was a Revolutionary Soldier.

I regret that we do not have the staff to undertake as large an undertaking as your search would require. Mrs. Eugene H. Ray, Weissinger Gaulbert, Louisville, Ky., does this type of work commercially. However it might be best to have the work and research done in Maryland where some of the marriages took place.

I received with most interest and pleasure your letter of august 4. I am so sorry you never had the one I wrote a year ago endosing the kind introduction from Miss Mary CHURCHILL HUMPHREY.

I should like to get , if it is possible , informations on my great grand mother's family, established in Kentucky and at Baltimore, at the end of eighteenth century.

I discovered in our archives, some papers which gave me a basis, an a very curious notice on her grand gather and grand mother's fortune.

I enclose here a little memorandum. Is it possible to find : 1°- The descendance of Mr. and Mrs. BUTLER (she was Miss FINN, sister of Mary, Ann FINN, married to Daniel O'BRIEN, father of my great grand mother

2°- The copy of Mr. FINN's testament, kept by the Orphan's Court.

3°- Any informations on Mr. FINN's goods, situated in Kentucky, at Red Stone, near Red River.

Translation Memorandum in letter from Philippe d'Estailleur-Chanteraine
Paris, August 28, 1950

My great grandmother Madam d'Estailleur was born Eleanor O'Brien. She came into the world at Cork Ireland in 1784. Her mother was Mary Ann Finn and was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Finn. She had one sister Elizabeth and two brothers James and John.

Mr. Finn an old Catholic gentleman was unwilling to support the English government and left Ireland in 1776 and established himself in the United States and obtained from the American Government the grants to vast territories in Kentucky near Redstone.

He put his daughter Mary Ann age 16 years in a boarding school at Baltimore and went with his two sons to Redstone.

The War of the Independence having already started he served the American cause.

At the same time there arrived from Ireland a young man very beautiful who joined the army of the insurgents who rose to the grade of Captain. His name was Daniel O'Brien.

At Baltimore he met Mary Ann Finn. He fell in love with her and married her without the consent of his father. Several years later in 1790 being an unhappy marriage and a voyage to Ireland, Mary Ann Finn died in Virginia in 1790, leaving a son 10 years old and James and a daughter Eleanor.

When dying, Mrs. O'Brien entrusted her daughter and sons to her sister Elizabeth, married in Baltimore to a very fine man, Captain Butler who commanded his own vessel.

Awaiting his return, Mrs. Butler had, as mentioned, the children, left them with an excellent woman, a friend of Mrs. O'Brien, and named Mrs. Welch, who was known for her affectionate disposition and goodness. Their aunt returned to Baltimore with her husband. With her characteristics developed before the war which were severe and inflexible returned by herself without her husband during reign of unrest. Capt. Butler was killed in one of his expeditions. Mrs. Butler two years afterwards married Mr. Pilch.

Life continued its course the same for Eleanor and James, abandoned by their father since James had entered the ~~army~~ American Navy and had obtained an engagement on Ship "Minerva". Eleanor still living with her guardian friend in boarding house of her mother and from which married a Frenchman Mr. Vochez.

A short time afterwards the Vochez's quitted the United States for England where they frequented, met French emigrants among whom was a painter of great talent, Dan Loux and the Count and Countess de Busness.

As the Consulate had opened since the exile of Bonaparte and the ports of France to which those who had fled the terror, which had not taken up arms against their country, the Dan Loux's and de Busness and the Vochez's came back to Paris.

It is there that Eleanor met a young man 28 years old, Francois Hippolyte d'Estailleur, since his family had been ruined by the Revolution and he had become a celebrated architect and put to his work perseverance and his diligence had redeemed his situation.

On the 13th February 1803 Eleanor and Francois were married in Paris. In 1818 Eleanor received a letter from her brother James who informed her of the death of their grand parents Finn in Kentucky and also informed that the Orphans Court were occupied with the succession and that they had both inherited everything, with their cousins Butlers.

James Butler himself wrote begging them to address ~~them~~ at Baltimore a lawyer and acknowledgment and instructions for this estate. Eleanor affirmed this information through the ~~Consul~~ of the U.S. and sent same to Mr. Hughes at Baltimore.

Since then they received a letter of James Butler without address that had then \$ further supporters with those of our family and new suggestions concerning residue of estate of Mr. Finn of Red Stone.

I will look for it but in the meantime, if you would write again telling me what you want, and giving as much information as you can so that I may have that to start on, I will make an effort to help you. Of course we do not have a great deal of material on Pennsylvania, but may have just what you need. At any rate we would like to make the effort. I suggest you send us your line back giving dates of birth, death and marriage and location as far as you can, and indicate the missing information you want.
