Folders 7-8 hold three diaries written by James Gabhart in 1928-1931, while he was a patient at Waverly Hills Sanatorium. He describes his symptoms, his interaction with physicians and nurses, his treatments, the activities and the deaths of other patients, and his visits home. The last diary documents his departure from Waverly Hills in late May to spend his "last days," as he notes, at his mother's house before he dies at the sanatorium in August.

Collection includes letters dated from 1929-30, from Stella Hatfield, a patient at Waverly Hills Sanatorium. She writes letters to Miss Overman, Bingham's assistant requesting needed clothes or other items. She often describes her activities at the hospital.

Collection includes a single undated presentation perspective drawing in pen pencil and ink, mounted on heavy board. Drawing is a 3-D bird's eye view of the sanitarium and grounds. The tuberculosis hospital operated from 1910-1962, and closed when modern antibiotics made such a facility obsolete. Additionally, multiple projects rolls in the collection were protectively wrapped in discarded architectural drawings - many of which depicted Waverly Hills Sanitarium. Many of these 'wrappers' were retained, and are contained in box 36 (the project index notes this where applicable). See the project index and finding aid for more information.
