James Mc Daniel's widow Elizabeth  
Robertson married John Mc Knight  
probably in Washington Co. Ind in  
1815. She was born in 1786 <sup>(census)</sup> (Ky or Tenn)

The copy of the marriage register  
1827 from Jefferson Co was almost  
illegible.

## Notes

The grave of Jennings McDaniel was found by the author in the summer of 1985. He is buried at the foot of an old post oak in the run-down family cemetery in Barren County on the old Glasgow-Munfordville Road (County Road 685) once known as the "Salt Works Road." The cemetery is directly across the road from a huge sink hole adjacent to Salem Baptist Church, a church actually started by his family members in 1820, two years after Jennings's death.

His tombstone reads "Ginnings (sic) McDaniel 1772-1818." Mt. Tabor Baptist Church records report his death as having occurred in August. On the other side of the tree, Mary (Polly) Singleton McDaniel, his wife, is buried. Her marker states she died August 11, 1846. A marriage bond from Garrard County shows they married in October, 1798.

Also in this graveyard stands a very old tombstone the same size and shape of Jennings's with the simple inscription "Elizabeth McDaniel." This is thought to be Jennings's mother, whose maiden name might have been "Walker" since we find at least three descendants with that first name.

In 1780 a William McDaniel surveyed and claimed land on Beech Fork in Jefferson County, Kentucky. Nineteen years later, Jennings claimed 120 1/2 acres on Beech Fork in Nelson Co. In 1801 a William McDaniel, living in Jessamine Co., claimed 100 acres in Barren Co. in the name of Henry Brenton, Clark Co., Indiana Territory. In 1802 Jennings, also living in Jessamine, claimed 100 acres in Barren Co. on Beaver Creek, again in Brenton's name. It is assumed this is the same tract of land. In 1803 William's name disappears from Jessamine's tax list. He does not move to Barren Co., but more than likely is either Jennings's father or brother.

It is believed that Jennings migrated to Kentucky from Virginia somewhere between 1772 and 1794. (On the 1850 census, his brother, John, is listed as being born in Virginia.) Jennings's name first appears in Kentucky on the Fayette tax lists in 1794 when he would have been 21 or 22 years of age. He was assessed for two colts and two mules. An item in "The Kentucky Gazette" Nov. 1, 1794 reports he lived "at the Seventeen Mile Tree on Hickman Road [and] found a mare."

He served as bondsman August 1, 1796 in Mercer Co., Kentucky in the marriage of William Reynals (sic) and Elizabeth Fuget. (The bride's father was listed as "Tom Fugitt.") John McDaniel was a witness. Jessamine Co. lists Jennings on tax lists until 1802 when he moved to Barren County. He and his brother, John, were mentioned both as "pioneers" and "carpenters" in "Times of Long Ago," an early history of Barren County by Franklin Gorin. Gorin's aunt, Margaret (Peggy) Franklin Waggener, married John in 1813.

Perrin's history describes him as "one of the pioneers of Barren County...one of its extensive land owners and farmers." The Barren Co. Order Book 1-2 (1799-1805) "Ordered that Jinnins McDannel (sic) be appointed surveyor of the road from the Courthouse to Beaver Creek near John Hall's in the room of John Phillips and the hands within one mile on each side of the road do attend to keep the same in repair."

He apparently indentured himself to Henry Brenton from the time he moved to Barren County until July, 1815 when he bought all 200 acres for \$1,000. In December, 1815 he sold a large portion of the land to Henry Miller for \$650, and in March, 1816, sold another large tract to Henry Crutcher for \$600. On July 3, 1817, he bought 400 acres from Henry Crutcher ("next to the 'Great Sink'") for \$800. In 1818 he died intestate, perhaps suddenly, at the relatively young age of 46, leaving five daughters and two sons. (The oldest son at almost 12 was Floyd Walker McDaniel.) Samuel Perrin Bowdry, Jennings's son-in-law, and husband to Sally, his first-born, became administrator of the estate.

The estate of Jennings McDaniel was appraised and recorded in the Barren County Court House on December 16, 1818. His property was divided into eight lots. His widow, Mary, received two lots and each child one apiece. His property included six slaves: "one woman and a young child," and four girls named Mariah, Silva, Rebecca, and Naomi. The girls were dowered to daughters Elizabeth Douglas, Mary, Ruth Terry, and Melissa respectively.

Four of Jennings's children married into the Terry, Douglass, and Floyd families who were, respectively, from Botetourt, Bedford, and Amherst Counties in Virginia. In addition, the father of Peggy Waggener McDaniel was also from Amherst Co. More than likely, the families were not total strangers when they came to Kentucky.

Recently at your library I saw a book entitled KNOX COUNTY BIRTHS 1852-1862. I had a xerox copy made of Page 31 showing the McDaniel births. In the 1880's these families changed their name to McDonald.

I would appreciate your making me a copy of the title page or some information where I could locate the original document as there is an error and I am not sure if it is typographical or on the original document.

KNOX CO. KY MARRIAGES

James McDaniel married Rebecca Harrison, 25 Dec 1839

William McDaniel married Lucinda "sena" "Seanna" Harrison,  
14 Feb 1843.

On page 31 of the book I am sure the William McDaniel born 1-23-1853 was my husbands Gr Grandfather and born to William McDaniel and sena Harrison and not Rachael, however; it could have been James and Rachael. There were so many Williams in the family. I have not seen the 1860 Knox County census but the 1870 census for James does not have a son named William, so he could have died.

My husbands Gr Grandfather is buried in the Fisher Cemetery, Knox Co., and his marker is sandstone and inscribed by hand. It appears he was born 23 Dec 1852 and died August 1908.

I am enclosing to you a letter that we received in 1955 from  
Jessie Iles Scafani, who was inquiring about the family your are researching.  
This verifys your Iles/McDaniel believe, and tells us the father of Elizabeth  
Crockett Iles, as Thomas who came to Kentucky in 1788.

In looking at the 1830 census index in which I enclose a copy  
of the page of McDaniel's/McDonnald. I see a Henry listed in Bath Co. on page  
193. I see no John E. McDonal listed in Bath Co. I do however see in Bath Co.  
Will book the will of John E. McDonal, Nov. 2, 1833.  
To wife Elizabeth and Children (Children unfortunately are not  
mentioned by name). Executors: Spencer Boyd and Thomas Iles  
Witnesses: James M. Johnson; William B. Kirk; and Thomas Southmore.  
The will was probated Nov. 1838.

Also in Bath Co. I see the marriage of Elizabeth Iles to John  
E. McDonald 8 October 1822.

We have no published history of the Iles family.

In a History of Bath County Kentucky by J.A. Richards published  
in 1961, you may find something helpful. This book is not indexed, so cannot  
take the time allowed to me to search it more carefully.

If I can help again, let me know.

Dear Mrs. Baya:

Our records are much too early to help with your research pertinent to Wallace McDaniel. There are many sources available in county records at the court house which should prove helpful. Also, I suggest that you write Cave Hill Cemetery and inquire if other McDaniels are buried on the McDaniel lot.

The 1899 Louisville City Directory lists Wallace E. McDaniel, watchman, J.G. Mattingly Co residing at 3312 Highland Avenue and Lewis McDaniel, clerk at the Louisville and Nashville Railroad, at the same address.

The Bureau of Vital Statistics in Frankfort, Kentucky have, I believe, some birth and death records for the city of Louisville, Kentucky prior to 1911. If you request this information you should know the day and month of Wallace's death as well as the year 1900. Cave Hill Cemetery will give you the date of his interment and most likely there will be a brief notice of his death in a local paper.

In Louisville there is an excellent researcher, Mrs. Clyde W. Hamm, 3507 Pinecone Circle, Louisville, Kentucky 40222. If you would be interested in her assistance, I suggest you write her.

## Mc Daniel Genealogy

The following information my Grandmother ORA ETTE OWEN MCDANIEL gave to me in the early 1960's. I actually do not have very much info on this family. Although while living in Memphis, Tn. did find the McDaniel Census for 1900-1910.

James Green McDaniel was my grandfather and a minister of the First Christian Church in Maulden, Mo. He died when I was 5 years of age. We were very close during our short time together but I do not recall many details. He had a very severe stroke during a baptism at his church, being partially paralyzed and unable to speak. Of course, this ended his ministry. The family then moved to Memphis, Tn. where he later died. He was taken back to Maulden, Mo. for burial.
