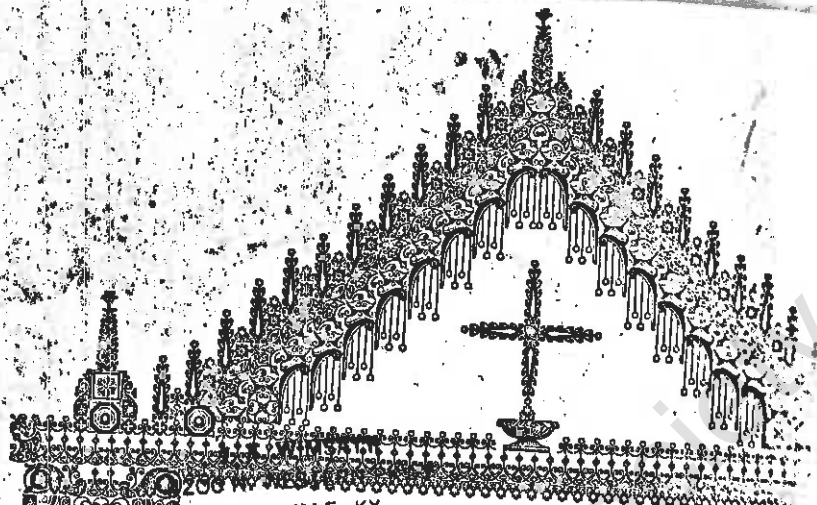

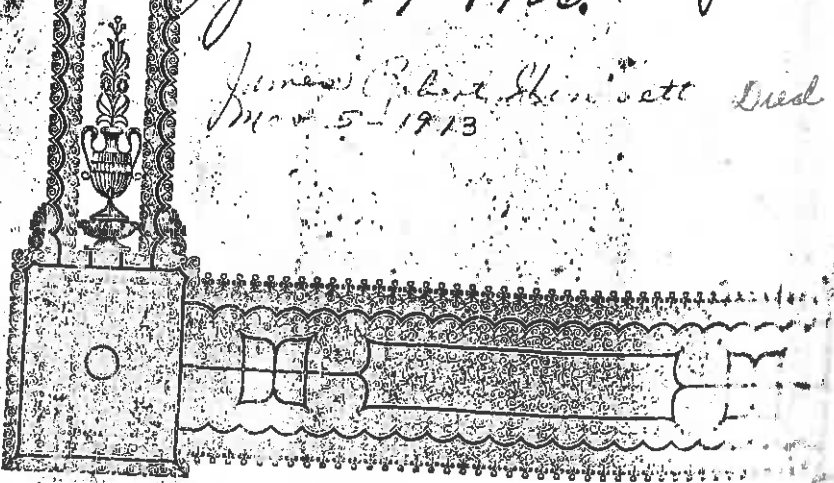

FATHER ABELL'S FIRST MASS, This Trinity Sunday.

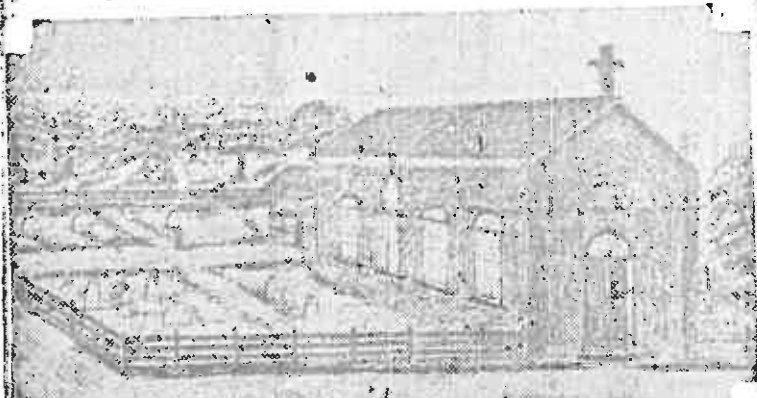
The handsome and memorable Church of the Sacred Heart on West Broadway and Seventeenth Street, Louisville, will be the scene of a notable function this Sunday, the feast of the Most Holy Trinity.

This solemn function will be the First Mass of the just ordained Reverend Father John M. Abell, a scion of a noted, historical and priestly Kentucky Catholic family.

It will be a Solemn Mass at the hour of ten o'clock, with the Neo Presbyter as the Celebrant; the Very Rev. James P. Cronin, V. G., as Assisting Priest; the Rev. Dr. James Coyle, the distinguished preacher and scholar, of Taunton, Mass., and former student of Kentucky's St. Thomas Seminary, as Deacon; and the Rev. J. J. Abell, of St. John, Ky., an Uncle of the Celebrant, as Sub-deacon. The impressive, sacred ceremonies will be under the direction of the pastor of the Church of the Sacred Heart, Rev. Father Patrick Walsh. The sermon will be preached by the Reverend Dr. Coyle.

The celebrant, the Rev. John M. Abell, will be ordained Priest this Easter-Saturday, the 10th inst., at St. Meinrad's Seminary, Ind., by the Right Rev. Bishop-Coadjutor Chartrand, of Indianapolis. He is a direct descendant of one of Maryland-Kentucky's oldest, pioneer Catholic families, and is connected by lineal ties of blood with the late Archbishop Martin John Spalding, of Baltimore, and Archbishop John Lancaster Spalding, of Peoria. A remarkable feature of young Father Abell's priesthood is, that, together with the priesthood of his grand-uncle, Rev. Robert A. Abell, and his present-living uncle, Rev. J. J. Abell, of St. John, Ky., he will, now in brief while, complete one century of continuous family priesthood in the diocese of Louisville. The Abell family of Kentucky, dates from the late years of the 18th century. The Kentucky Catholic pioneer Robert Abell, son of Samuel Abell, Hereditary High Sheriff of St. Mary's County, Maryland, came to Kentucky in the year 1788, as a member of the "Catholic League." This was one year later than the first division led by Basil Hayden. Robert Abell was a member, and the only Catholic member, of the Constitutional Convention of 1799. His sons were Rev. Robert A. Abell, James and Jesse Abell. Jesse Abell represented his district in the Kentucky Legislature in 1831, and again, about ten years later. Rev. Father J. J. Abell, pastor at St. John, Ky., is a grandson of James Abell, brother of Jesse Abell, and young Father Abell, who will celebrate his first Mass this Sunday, is, on his father's side a descendant of James Abell and on his mother's side a descendant of Jesse, brother of James Abell. Alethia Abell, daughter of Robert Abell, married Richard Spalding from whom are descended the Most Rev. Martin John and the Most Rev. J. Lancaster Spalding. Father Robert A. Abell, born in 1792, ordained in 1818, preached the sermon at the dedication of the Bardstown Cathedral in 1819, and, fifty years later preached that Cathedral's golden jubilee sermon. In 1823 he was made pastor of the Church of St. Louis, in Louisville. The writer of this knew Father Robert A. Abell well; he was, indeed, the Priest Eloquent.

Jubilee Mass Is Planned

Pastor of St. Columba's
Church to Celebrate Silver
Anniversary.

The Rev. John M. Abell, pastor of St. Columba's Church, 36th and Market, the past nine years, will celebrate his silver jubilee mass at 10 a.m. Wednesday there.

A native of Divernon, Ill., Father Abell was ordained June 10, 1911, by the late Bishop Joseph Chartrand, of Indianapolis, and celebrated his first mass in Sacred Heart Catholic Church here. He has held pastorates at St. Theresa's, Rhodelia, Ky.; St. John's, St. John, Ky., and St. Alphonsus, St. Joseph, Ky.

Father Abell will be assisted at the jubilee mass by Father Charles Rahm, pastor of St. John's, deacon; Father A. J. Thompson, pastor of St. Stephen Church, Owensboro, Ky., sub-deacon; Father Daniel A. Driscoll, rector of Cathedral, master of ceremonies; Father Robert Canty, Calvary, Ky., cross bearer; Father Herman J. Lammers, assistant Cathedral, and Father James Mills, Fancy Farms, Ky., thurifers; Father Jerome Lammers, assistant St. George, and Father J. A. O'Bryan, assistant Holy Cross, acolytes. Father C. P. Raffo, pastor of St. Charles Borromeo, will deliver the sermon.

Present in the sanctuary will be Father B. Riedford of St. Vincent's, Shelbyville, Ind., and Father Kipp of Deadwood, S.D., classmates of the jubilarian. Father E. Erle Willett, vicar general of the Louisville Diocese, together with seventy-five other priests of the diocese, will also assist at the mass.

A parish and jubilee reception will be held Wednesday at 8 p.m. at the parish hall.
