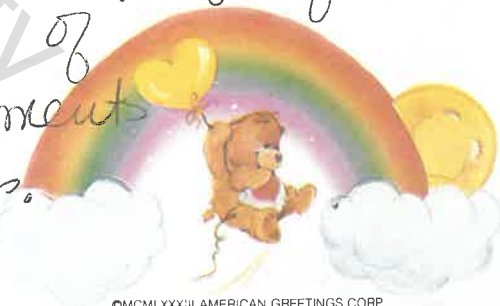

Several years ago, I wrote your club requesting information on the following family.

Richard FISHER born 1810 Ky
married Elizabeth(Bettie)_____ also born 1810 Ky

and removed to Missouri prior to 1836.

where they had Wm Woodson b. 1836, Caleb 1844, Allen 1844, Nancy, & Abraham
As you can see I had very little information and your staff kindly advised me that if I could place these people as to area, some help might possibly be rendered.

Years of research revealed little but recently what I hope will prove to be a great find.

Daniel FISHER believed to be a child of Richard, above, by a second marriage died in 1962 in Topeka, Kansas. I am sorry to say I did not know of his existence prior to his death. However, the Social Welfare Dept for Topeka remember correspondence with my grandparents and state that Daniel definitely was an uncle to my grandfather (now deceased) so would be a son of Richard above. In any event, he gives his birth date as March 4, 1962 or March 4, 1963 at LOUISVILLE, KY. Since many of Richard's sons served in Civil War, it is possible he returned to his old home during the war at which time he had this youngest son (a full 20 to 30 years younger than his other family).

Daniel says on his papers that he came to Kansas at age 6 which would be 1869 which would be why I have been unable to locate him on Kansas state census of 1865 (where I thought he was).

We have only family tradition from great-grandfather Caleb above that when he returned from civil war there was this new baby plus the fact that Daniel was in correspondence with my grandparents. We have been able to find nothing on Richard or the maiden name of his wife. It is also said that his family once held title in Germany but I have found no supporting evidence of this.

Any help or guidance will be sincerely appreciated.

Transylvania. (To the editor of the Couier Journal).

There being so much general interest taken in the observance of the 150th anniversary of the founding of Transylvania University, I venture a further contribution in an effort to settle two important questions relative thereto.

As to the physical location of the first class rooms of the seminary, which has long been a matter of public discussion, Mrs. Charles F. Norton, librarian of Transylvania College, of Lexington, Ky., has written me as follows:

"You ask the location of the house of the Rev. David Rice where the first classes of Transylvania Seminary were taught. Deeds in Mercer and Lincoln Counties show that he owned much land. So far as we are informed no records show where he lived in 1785, the date of the opening of the school."

Frequent references have been made to the startling mortality, due to Indian warfare, among the early trustees of Transylvania, as mentioned in my previous letters. Mrs Norton has included this list in her letter. The dates are, she says, from Charles R. Staples of Lexington, Ky., who has done much useful research in Ky. history. An interesting fact is that four of the trustees were killed by Indians before the "posthumous" birth of the seminary in 1785. The other three fell during the next five years, 1785 to 1790. Hence the early history of higher education in Kentucky and the West was truly written in blood, evidence of Indian valor in their final desperate rally to hold their great game hunting grounds.

The list follows:

John Todd, killed at the battle of Blue Licks, 8-19-1782. Stephen Trigg, killed in the same battle. John Floyd, killed in 1783. Walker Daniel, killed in 1784. William Christian, killed north of Ohio River, 1786. Isaac Cox, killed 1788. John May, killed on the Ohio River in 1790.

Of much historic value on this subject is a letter I have just received from Miss Ann Eliza Fisher, in part, as follows:

"I have been much interested in your two recent letters in the point of view column of the Couier Journal and feel I must write you, that I think you are correct in regard to Transylvania and Stephen Fisher's Fort.

"I am a great- great- grand-daughter of Stephen Fisher, and much surprised to read of the celebration on the Robinson farm, some weeks ago.

"My father often spoke of the things his grandfather Stephen Fisher Jr., told him, and always Fisher's Garrison was located just at the eastern limits of Danville and Transylvania was at Danville.

Stephen Fisher owned 16,000 acres, extending from east of Danville to the Kentucky River, and one of the first roads in the State was Fisher's Fort Road which the Highway Commission a few years ago decided to call the Bradley Highway.

"The fact that part of the original Fisher Tract was north of Danville, may have led to the mistaken idea that the Fort was on the Robinson farm, but such was not the case. My father, grandfather and great- grandfather were all born and reared on what is now the Yeager farm on the Lancaster pike, where we still own the old burying- ground, where the wife of Stephen Fisher is buried. He was killed by the Indians and his body was never recovered.

"It has been a tradition in our family that Rosanna Fisher was the first girl baby born in Kentucky to white People. She married Martin Hardin, who held office under Governor Shelby."

Miss Fisher corroborates both Mrs. S. Graham's statement in the Draper Manuscript and Collins History of Kentucky as to the location of Fort Fisher and gives additional testimony to the belief of some historians that Father Rice lived near Fort Fisher, when the seminary classes were started, and that the location was within or near the present city limits of Danville.

Miss Fisher's original letter will be given to the Wilson Club for reference as of historical value.

6th. from Adam Fisher (b. 1740 in Culpepper Co. Va. d. 1812 in Mercer Co. Ky.) Adam Fisher left with the 1st. Regiment that kept Culpepper Co. Va. in the Revolutionary War. His father, Lewis Fisher was called "The Exiled Baron", who came to Culpepper Co. Va. in 1715 from Strasboneg and died in Culpepper Co. Va., 1773 leaving a large plantation to wife and children, stating in his will dated Feb. 1773, recorded in the Culpepper Court House, that "If my Germany estate should be recovered it should be equally divided among all of my children." His grandson Simion was empowered to obtain this property amounting to thousands of acres, deer parks, etc. He sailed for New Orleans in 1800, but the ship went down on the coast of Cuba and all were lost. Later efforts to obtain this estate then failed because of the Statute of limitations. Lewis Fisher's grave is on his plantation plainly marked under a large chestnut tree.

The three sons, Adam, Stephen and Barnet, came to Kentucky in 1779 when they had land grants amounting to several thousand acres. They established Fort Fisher as a protection against the Indians and lived there for three years. The daughter of Stephen Fisher and his wife, Molly Fisher was Rosanna Fisher, said to be the first white child born in Kentucky- born Nov. 25, 1781. In 1806 she was married to Martin Hardin. (See Redford's History). Though living in the midst of Indian depredations she lived to be 90 years old, with all her faculties to the last and was a woman of strong character and great Christian fortitude, with brilliant conversational ability. The granddaughter of Adam Fisher, (b. Nov. 12, 1769, in Culpepper Co. Va. d. Nov. 1. 1825 in Jefferson Co. Ky.) is buried beside her husband, Henry Frederick Kalfus, near Jeffersontown, Ky.

In doing research on my father's Fisher genealogy, I contacted a distant relative in Tampa, Florida. We share the same great-grandfather, Theodorick Fisher. Her name is Kathryn Pitney Noel. She has the Fisher Family Bible. She loaned it to me so I could make copies of the Family Record that was in the bible.

I thought you might like to keep a copy, incase others are researching the same families. There is a record of a black family that were slaves of Theodorick Fisher. I have a record of the sale of those slaves in 1851 to John Tompkins of Ghent, Kentucky. This is recorded in Carroll County Court House.

Theodorick and Judith Fisher lived in Walton, Kentcky, Ghent, and owned property in Grant County. His father, Amos, had emigrated to Grant County from Newport, New Hampshire.

The Ellis and Pitney families lived near Ghent until at least ~~1870~~ 1860. They appeared in The Augusta, Illinois census of 1870.

If you have no use for such biblical family records, I would appreciate it if you would send it to the Kentucky State Archives and Library in Frankfort, Kentucky.

If anyone is doing serious research, they could contact me at the above address, as I might have copies of other information they might want.

Dear Mrs. Morris:

In Mercer County, Kentucky records I find the will of Adam Fisher which was written April 25, 1804 and probated in the October court of 1812. The legatees are: wife whose name is not given; six children; two sons: Jeremiah and Adam Fisher, Jr; four daughters: Margaret Watts, Anne Colfus, Susannah Schooling, and Elizabeth Fisher. Executors: sons, Jeremiah and Adam Fisher. Witnesses: James Fisher, Randolph Mock, and Barnet Fisher.

We do not have Mason County wills. In the marriage records I find the marriage of Adam Fisher and Sarah Thomas on 30 January, 1800.

The early Shelby County wills which we have for the period from 1792 to 1811 do not mention any Fishers.

In Jefferson County deeds the name of Peter Fisher appears twice. On 27 March, 1804 Peter Fisher and wife, Deborah sold 64 acres of land in same county. He is mentioned as Peter Fisher of Shelby County. Also on April 29, 1805 he bought a tract of 206 acres.

In our library are many early records of Kentucky counties but we do not, however, have a complete coverage for all areas of our state. I would suggest that if you wish to have further genealogical work done on the Fishers, you contact either of the following:

Dear Miss Jeffries:

Replying to your letter of July 7th, we do have a book The Fisher Families of the Southern States by Charles Brunk Heinemann, 1004 Chandler Building, Washington D.C., thanks to Mr. Thomas C. Fisher. Mr. Fisher was able to borrow the typed copy from Mr. Heinemann and had a typed copy made and was kind enough to send us a carbon copy, all bound, with an index. So far as I know it has not been printed and so I doubt if one could be purchased, but a letter to Mr. Heinemann might bring out other information.

I have used the index and find one Thomas G. Fisher, (no Thomas Grant Fisher) He was the son of Stephen J. Fisher, born 18 46 and Thomas G. born 1884, so cannot be your Thomas Grant. I have also looked under Susannah (Frances) Gaines but do not find her in the index.

I have just looked in our Fayette County marriage records, copy of which we have in our library and find that our record shows the name as Grant Thomas Fisher who married Francis Gaines, Oct. 31, 1805 and the bondsman was Francis Kishner Gaines. In the Fisher book there is a Grant Fisher no date of birth or death, son of Daniel Fisher, no birth or death married Jane Kox, and Daniel's oldest brother was born Dec. 3, 1805, being s n of Daniel Fisher and Denearas Starbuck, no dates.

From the above I would say this book will do you very little good. Also in the index I do not find a Francis Gaines.

If you want research made on this I suggest Mr. John Frederick Dorman III, No. 1 Hill Top Court, Louisville, Ky.

I have looked through the Louisville City Directories for these years: 1859-1860; 1864-1865; 1865-66. The name of Richard Fisher does not appear. He may have lived, however, in the country outside of the city limits and if this theory be true, he would not be listed in the city.

While at Filson Club, June 1947, you helped me find data about Fisher Family Number Ten, from "Fisher Families of the Southern States," by Chas. B. Heineman, Wash. D.C.

Charles B. Heineman, has little data about John B. Fisher's family of thirteen children - his first wife - and second wife of his old age.

I have finally put this family together the past three years - have the names and much data on Rev. Thos. J. Fisher, who was a brother of my Great Grandfather, Robert H. Fisher, who died 1915, Louisville, Kentucky.

At present hope to soon in future locate just where the body of Rev. T.J. Fisher was re-interred, after being first buried in Louisville, Kentucky. His daughter Mary Fisher Gray, of Bardstown, Kentucky, removed his body to Bardstown, Ky., 1884, and to date have failed to locate just where cemetery is located and where the Gray-Fisher folks are buried. Have had items placed in the Bardstown Paper -- and had an answer from a lady, who told me last week, the old Gray home of Judge Samuel Gray, husband of Mary Fisher, dau. of Thos. Jefferson Fisher and wife Elizabeth Naylor, is now a Tourist Court..

After the census schedules are finished, which I hope to have done in very near future, I believe this family history will be near completion, and I believe I own the only copy of this family and their children, as none of the other members of family have shown little interest - until I began to put together, John B. Fisher's children, and their children.

Have located two real daughters of children of old John B. Fisher - one lives in Arizona and the other in Kentucky -- and their clues have lead me to other counties and further data, just when I think have about exhausted all clues.

I have several hundred families involved and have kept carbon copies of all mail - and find that most of Kentucky must be related to each other, thru marriage.

Also, I am at a loss to know just what to do with this data, I have compiled, as Mr. Heinman, just told me to send him a copy - and has made no effort to assist with completing work of family, in Washinton, D.C. Archive files. I don't feel I care to send him my work - and let him have credit, or put in files, for further books, or revised edition.

I started the search to locate the parents of John B. Fisher - and where he was born in Pennsylvania, and names of his parents, who were German born - and this I have still to locate - and became sidetracked with the 13 children of John B. Fisher.

I still have Virginia records to search thru as John B. Fisher lived in Virginia, until he enlisted in the Indian War, from Botetourt Co., Va., 1791-1794 - also why did he go to live in Virginia while a young man from Pennsylvania?

The Library at Richmond, Virginia does not answer mail and refers one to a paid genealogical worker - Newberry Library, Chicago, Ill., does not have orderly books - county record books of all counties in Virginia - just a smattering, of tax - etc.

So, this must wait till I complete Kentucky records of the Fisher family, before all the old folks are dead who can faintly recall dates - places where they lived, which helps a great deal, and makes looking thru records easier, when you know the families and how to put in order.

John Coakley of 722 So. 12th St., Louisville, Ky., has been most helpful to me - he married a Fisher - and also his Grandmother was one of the 13 children of old John B. Fisher Mary Ann Fisher - who married H.L. Spratt, of LaRue County, Ky. She is buried beside her Father, John B. Fisher and wife (1st) Mary Leftredge Brown Fisher, Nollynn Cemetery, Hodgenville, Ky.

I am hoping that Filson Club has some Virginia records more complete than at Newberry Library, Chicago, Illinois, so old John B. Fisher data can be located.

Have photostat copies of file at Archives of Pension Record of John B. Fisher - some 68 or more pages -- none give where in Pennsylvania he was born - nor names of parents. He lived so long -- and folks may not have recalled - his children didn't - or if they did - no records were made.

Wishing you success in your work, I am,
Your letter of January 30 has been received. I fear Mr. Altshellar overlooked his intention to give his letter, from Miss Anna Eliza Fisher, to The Filson Club as we have no record of it here. We do have a book on The Fisher Family of The Southern States, by Charles Brunk Heinemann, Washington, D. C. I say book but it is really a typed manuscript, bound. I find where Lewis Fisher and Anna Barbara (Blankenbaker) Fisher, had, among other children, a son Stephen, born 1736 and died 1817. He married Mary Magdaline Garr in Culpeper County, Virginia about 1759. She was the sister of Elizabeth Garr who married his brother Adam Fisher. Both were daughters of John Adam Garr.

Stephen was in Culpeper County as late as 1789, according to deeds listed. He served in active service in the Revolutionary War and was assigned duty in Kentucky. There are several pages about this Stephen but it is too much to copy. He appears in the Mercer County Tax list in 1813. He died in Mercer County, Kentucky, leaving a will dated May 2, 1817, probated October Court 1817. The Abstract reads as follows:

"FISHER, STEPHEN SR. 5-2-1817. Will Leg. wife Magdaline Fisher, 4 sons: Elias, Benjamin, Stephen and Elijah Fisher. 7 daus: Elizabeth Yager, Jemimah Sothern, Mary Davis, Agnes Bulger dead., Susanna Slaughter, Rosanna Hardin and Ann Gaines. Grandson, Elias Fisher. Exors: 4 sons. Witt: Fanny Dickson, Joseph Hancock, James Fisher and Stephen Fisher. Prob: Oct. Ct. 1817. Page 49"

According to this, Mary Magdaline was still living in 1817. The final settlement was made January 30, 1823. Mary Garr Fisher was named in the will of Benjamin Dickens in Garrard County, Kentucky, proven June 1804. He had married her sister Rosannah Garr in Virginia. In the list of Stephen and Mary Magdaline's children, I find Roseanna born Nov. 25, 1781 and died Nov. 24, 1876. She married Col. Martin Hardin July 4, 1806.

I think it would be well for you to come to Louisville and see this book on the Fisher Family.

We have your letter asking about information on Peter Fisher who came to Texas in 1845 as a member of the Peters Colony.

Inasmuch as Peter Fisher, according to the article in The Register of the Kentucky Historical Society, went to Texas from Pennsylvania, I believe you should write to Pennsylvania to find information concerning him.

We have here in The Filson Club the Index to The Pennsylvania Magazine of History, vols. 1 through 75, but the name of Peter Fisher is not listed.

The Filson Club, as you can see from our letterhead, is an historical society, not a genealogical society, and although we do have some genealogical records our staff is too small to allow us to do extensive genealogical research.

The Pennsylvania Historical Society at Philadelphia might have some early census records that would help you to find what county Peter Fisher came from.

In Mercer County, Kentucky records I find the will of Adam Fisher which
was written April 25, 1804 and probated in the October court of 1812.
The legatees are: wife whose name is not given; six children; two sons:
Jeremiah and Adam Fisher, Jr; four daughters: Margaret Watts, Anne Col-
fus, Susannah Schooling, and Elizabeth Fisher. Executors: sons, Jeremi-
ah and Adam Fisher. Witnesses: James Fisher, Randolph Mock, and Barnet
Fisher.

We do not have Mason County wills. In the marriage records I find the
marriage of Adam Fisher and Sarah Thomas on 30 January, 1800.

The early Shelby County wills which we have for the period from 1792 to
1811 do not mention any Fishers.

In Jefferson County deeds the name of Peter Fisher appears twice. On 27
March, 1804 Peter Fisher and wife, Deborah sold 64 acres of land in same
county. He is mentioned as Peter Fisher of Shelby County. Also on April
29, 1805 he bought a tract of 206 acres.

In our library are many early records of Kentucky counties but we do not,
however, have a complete coverage for all areas of our state. I would sug-

Inasmuch as Peter Fisher, according to the article in The Register of the Kentucky Historical Society, went to Texas from Pennsylvania, I believe you should write to Pennsylvania to find information concerning him.

We have here in The Filson Club the Index to The Pennsylvania Magazine of History, vols. 1 through 75, but the name of Peter Fisher is not listed.

The Filson Club, as you can see from our letterhead, is an historical society, not a genealogical society, and although we do have some genealogical records our staff is too small to allow us to do extensive genealogical research.

The Pennsylvania Historical Society at Philadelphia might have some early census records that would help you to find what county Peter Fisher came from.

My family of Fisher is Number Ten, in Charles B. Heineman, Wash., D.C. "Fisher Families of Southern States." I finally discovered the grave of T.J. Fisher, who was re-interred in Bardstown, Ky., 1884 - by dau. Mary F. Gray -- it took me three years - to discover T.J. Fisher's grave in the Gray Lot at Bardstown Cemetery, Bardstown, Ky., and enclose a snapshot for your files. Haven't had time to write out data for Chas. B. Heineman yet -- and send to him.

that on 1 March 1791, when Kentucky was still a part of Virginia,
Zachariah Fisher married Phoebe Brackett. The marriage bond was taken
out on the 25th of February, with George Holeman as bondsman. Phoebe
was the daughter of John Brackett, and Coleman Daniel was a witness
to the marriage, which was conducted by Joshua Morris.

I have enclosed an extract from the book Fisher Families of the
Southern States, which shows under "Fisher Family No. 48" what appears
to be your family. You may already have most of this information. I
am sorry that I cannot account for the fact that on this sheet Zachariah
Fisher's death date is given as 1837; the source of the information is

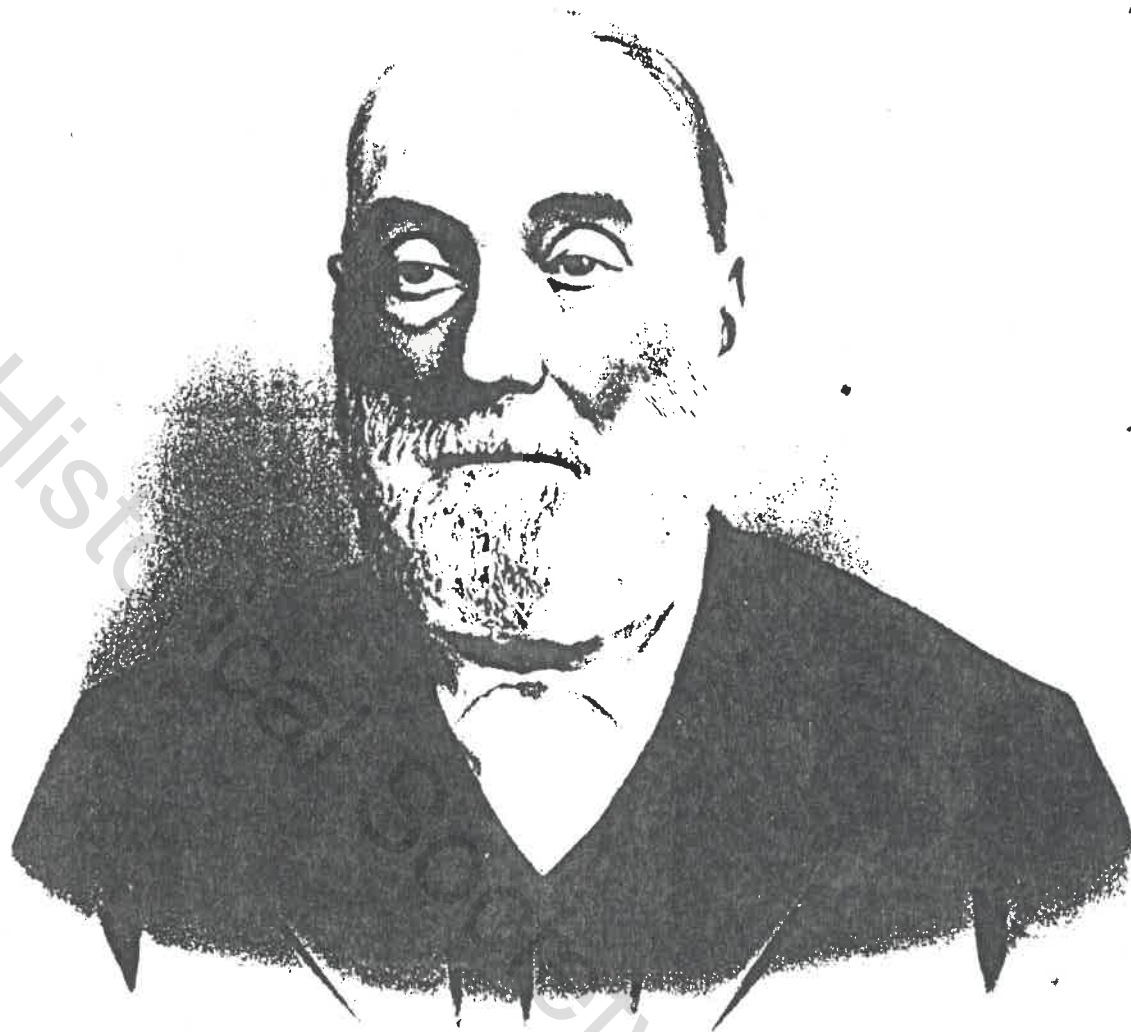

The Compiler/Author spent 30 years collecting information on the descendants of Adam Fisher and 2 years preparing the book for publication. It is copyrighted with copies in The Library of Congress.

Besides containing over 50 pictures and maps, the book records 1,299 descendants of Abraham, 2,036 descendants of Jacob, 817 descendants of Daniel, and 2,018 descendants of Adam, Jr.

This Adam Fisher arrived in America circa 1741-2 with wife and one son, Abraham; settled on the Schuylkill River about 12 miles from Philadelphia where sons Jacob, Daniel and Adam Jr. were born. Abraham (born circa 1730) eventually settled in Rockingham County, VA where he evidently took care of the family after Adam's death in 1757. ALL four brothers are said to have served as Revolutionary War soldiers but thus far only the descendants of Adam Jr. have proved this to be true about their ancestor, several gaining D.A.R. membership as a result. After the war, Abraham remained in Rockingham County until he was quite old when he removed to Yanceyville, N.C. to live with some of his children. Jacob lived first in Franklin County, VA where he married and later settled in Fredericks County, MD where he died. Daniel settled in Augusta County, VA where he died and Adam Jr. lived at Hagarstown, MD for a few years, then in Westmoreland County, PA until about 1796-7 when he went to Kentucky for a short time, then across the river to Clermont County, OH where he lived on Indian Creek until his death.

The Introduction of this book presents three Fisher families that were seeking fortunes (in Europe) in 1891. The basic history of these families should clarify the lineages of descendants of Adam Fisher of Holland and Sebastian Fisher of Hanover, Germany as well as those of Adam Fisher of this book.
