WATHEN LINEAGE

- I. John Wathen was born in England about 1625; died in England about 1698. He settled in St Mary's County, Maryland. Prior to 1647. He married Mary Mullett about 1650. She was born about 1630 and died after 1698.
- II. John Wathen, son of John Wathen I, was born in Charles County, Maryland about 1662; died 1705; married Susanna (Ann) Hudson about 1678. She was born after 1665; died after 1705. They had eight children. John Wathen was a carpenter by trade as is shown by records of early Maryland. He is mentioned also as a collector of debts in Maryland Archives.
- III. Hudson Wathen, fourth son of John Wathen II, was born in Charles County, Maryland, about 1694; died 1760. He married Sarah Mudd about 1715. Sarah was born about 1696 and died after 1760. Hudson was a prominent citizen in Charles County, Maryland. They had ten children.
- IV. Henry Hudson Wathen, fourth son of Hudson Wathen was born about 1741; died June 14, 1774; married Ann (last name unknown) His father left him but one shilling, which would indicate that he had been provided for previously. Henry and Ann Wathen had five children.
- V. Henry Hudson Wathen II, second son of Henry Hudson I, was born May 11, 1773; died June 1, 1851. He married (second time) Mary Spalding, daughter of Benedict and Althea Spalding. Henry's first wife bore him one son; Henry Hudson Wathen III. When a boy of 17, Henry Hudson Wathen II, volunteered for service in the Revolutionary War, serving as a Private in the Maryland Militia. He moved to Kentucky about 1788 or 90. After his marriage to Miss Spalding, he became a man of considerable ~~estate~~ estate in Washington County, which was later in Marion County. He was the founder of the Wathen Distilling business. His will was burned in the court house at Lebanon. He and Mary had eight children.
- VI. Joseph Spalding Wathen, ~~his~~ oldest child of Henry Hudson and Mary Spalding Wathen, was born in Marion County, Ky. near the site of the old Calvary Church and burying grounds, in which locality he lived until after his marriage to Elizabeth Green. He was born 1798; died 1879. He later moved to what is Larue County Ky. and obtained large tracts of land there. He and his half brother Henry Hudson married sisters, daughters of Leonard Green whose will was probated 1823 in Washington County. After the death of his wife Elizabeth, he married a Mrs. Katherine Weatherton, whose maiden name was Nallia or Nallay. She was a sister to the wife of his son Richard, and the widow of Bernard Weatherton. There was no children to this union. Joseph lived to eighty one years of age, and he and Elizabeth nine children. Buried in the Catholic Cemetery at Hodgenville, Ky.

VIII. Joseph Spalding Wathen 2nd- Born in Larue County, Ky Oct 18, 1852; died Married Jemima Warren, daughter of Elzay and Virginia Salsman Warren. Joseph Spalding Wathen was one of the leading citizens of the community in which he lived in Larue and Hart Counties, Ky. He later migrated to Kansas, then New Mexico and later Texas, where he still retains large land holdings.

1. William Warren- Born in Virginia in Oct, 1761; died in Green County, Kentucky, May 10, 1842; married about 1775 to Rhoda ----- (no record of last name) They were married in Greenville District, South Carolina. She was native of that State. When young, William moved with his father HUGH WARREN and family from Virginia to South Carolina. William's brother Hugh stated that during the war he resided "about twelve miles from Wofford's Iron Works within less than a mile of the Pacolet River in Ninety six district, South Carolina".

William volunteered some time in 1776 and served at various times, during the Revolutionary war, until 1782, amounting in all to almost two years, as Private under Captains Jeremiah Doty, Deanis Trambell, Jeremiah Dickson and Anthony Coulter, and Colonels Thomas and John Roebuck in the South Carolina Troops. He was on expeditions against the indians on the Savannah River, and in engagements with the Tories in South Carolina. His first service in 1776, was rendered as a substitute for his father, Hugh Warren, when he was only fifteen years of age. In 1779 he and his brother Hugh served together.

In 1796 William moved to Kentucky from South Carolina and settled in Green County, where he lived until his death. He applied for a pension Oct 20, 1834, which was allowed. He and Rhoda were both very young when married. To this couple thirteen children were born, as follows:

Of the family of Hugh Warren of Virginia, there were at least four members of whom served in the war for Independence. Hugh Warren, Sr. and his three sons: James, William, and Hugh, Jr. as shown by affidavits in the Pension applications of Hugh, Jr. , William, and his widow, Rhoda.

These three brothers all moved to Green County, Kentucky; William, about 1796, Hugh Jr. about 1800, and no record as to when James moved from South Carolina. He and his father were in the battle of Cowpens together under Captain Parsons.**

ii. Hugh Warren, son of William Warren, was born in ~~Green County, South Carolina~~ South Carolina Apr 16, 1784; died in Green County, Ky in 1873; married Elizabeth Hilbern 1811. He moved with his parents, when a boy of about twelve to Kentucky, where he married. Lived in Green County until his death at the home of his son Elzay, at nearly ninety years old. At this time all his children were married and his property disposed of, so there was no will made. Eleven children were born to Hugh and Elizabeth.

iii. Elzay Warren, son of Hugh Warren, was born in Green County, Ky. Apr 13, 1818; died 11 march, 1886; married in Green County, to Virginia Salsman Sept 12, 1850. She was daughter of Jacob Salsman and Ruth Young, his wife. Virginia was born July 13, 1834; died April 9, 1868. Elzay was a leading citizen of the community in which he lived and a successful farmer. His eldest son now lives on his old homestead. (1934) Although Virginia died when he was in middle life, he never remarried. There were eight children born to Elzay and Virginia, the youngest daughter being Jemima Warren of this Biographical sketch.

Henry Hudson Wathen I, b 1741; d 1774, son of Hudson Wathen and great-grandson of John Wathen who settled in Maryland from England prior to 1647; married Ann ---? Henry & Ann Wathen had five children.

Henry Hudson Wathen II, b 1766; d 1851. Second son of Henry H. Wathen I. Married Mary Spalding; b 1773; d 1849. The daughter of Benedict Spalding and Alotha Abell. His second marriage, by previous wife had one son; Henry Hudson Wathen III. Henry Hudson & Mary Spalding had eight children.

Joseph Spalding Wathen, b 1798; d 1879, the eldest son of Henry H. & Mary Spalding Wathen. He married Elizabeth Green; b 1791; d 1860. She was daughter of Leonard Green. Joseph & Elizabeth Wathen had nine children.

Thomas Wathen, b 1828; d 1900, was seventh child of Joseph & Elizabeth Wathen. He married MATILDA BEAUCHAMP b 1831; d 1915, married in 1851. She was daughter of John & Warissa Butler Beauchamp. Thomas & Matilda Wathen had twelve children.

Ida May Wathen, b Mar 16, 1871; d Aug 1, 1936. She was 12th child of Thomas & Matilda Wathen. Married JAMES MILTON MILBY b 1860; d 1933. He was the son of Alexander & Mary Wilson Milby, and a great-grandson of John Milby who settled the Milby family in Kentucky (Green County) in the 1780's.

William Beauchamp, no record of birth or death, was a native of Coventry, England. Migrated to Somerset, Maryland. He married one Ann Tighman, no record. Later settled in Kentucky, a son, Elijah born at Frankfort, Ky in 1760. No record of other children.

Elijah Beauchamp married Martha Maddox, daughter of one William Maddox of Franklin County. Elijah & Martha Beauchamp had a son, John Beauchamp who was born in Hardin County, no record of birth or death except that he died in Navarro County, Texas. He married twice, first wife was Warissa Butler, daughter of GEORGE & KATE ELLISON BUTLER, by whom had daughter MATILDA BEAUCHAMP and other children (no record)

No record of whom his second wife was, or of any children. She may have been a native of Texas as they were married there.

Brief Biography:

Joseph Spalding Wathen was named for his paternal grandfather, the Spalding being for the family name of his great-grandmother, Mary Spalding. After marriage he lived on his own farm near Mt. Sherman, Larue County, Ky. Later exchanged his farm with William Ford for one in Hart County.

He lived in Hart County 1889-1901. Improved farm, building new stock and feed barn; built new fences on place, cleared new land, improved orchards, etc. Was leading citizen in his community. Was trustee of local school, deacon of Baptist Church, and prominent in the civic and religious affairs of the community.

In December of 1901 he moved to Nemaha County, Kansas; farmed there 1902-1904. Moved to Dickinson County in 1905. In 1906 moved to New Mexico and homesteaded land there. Later disposed of this land for 400 acres of land in Mitchell County, Texas.

In whatever community he resided he was always improving, helping to better conditions and aiding in every possible way the progress of the community. Like his forefathers, who braved the wilds of Maryland and later the pioneer settlements of Kentucky, he too was a pioneer in the true sense of the word. He felled the trees of the virgin forests in Kentucky, he turned the prairie sod of Kansas, New Mexico, and Texas to reclaim the acreage for useful cultivation. His indomitable spirit has ever pushed on--working and tilling the soil even now in his eighty second year he is still toiling the soil, that which has ever been his livelihood. It is of such stock that nations are made and civilization continues and progresses.

Jemima Warren was born in Green County, Kentucky, that county which was named for the Revolutionary patriot General Nathaniel Greene, by his followers and admirers when they migrated to this wilderness after the close of the war for independence. She too is of pioneer stock and of the first families of America. Her ancestors were early pioneer settlers in Virginia; later South Carolina, and after the war for independence they migrated to the new state of Kentucky. They fought the British and Indians in the Revolutionary war, some being at the tender age of 15 when they shouldered the trusty flintlock for services for their country.

During the period of this wedlock, she has ever been the helpmate of her husband; aiding and helping in all his endeavors. In the early part of their wedlock, she spun wool, knit socks and gloves; wove cloth and made linsey dresses, jeans coats and trousers and other items used in the home. Despite all this labor and the usual household duties, she was ever ready to listen to others troubles and give a cheerful word; always ready to help the children with their problems in school and out. She too, is carrying on to the best of her ability and strength despite her seventy odd years. (1934)
