Dear Mrs. Phillips:

Your recent inquiry to The Filson Club about William McMechen, Surgeon in the Revolutionary War, has reached me for consultation. Some years ago I did some research on this gentleman and the 6,000 acres which were accorded him in Nelson County for his military services. No water course was given in Jillson's Kentucky Old Grants and Deeds, as I recall. In checking Nelson County, Kentucky Deeds I found no trace of the McMechen land so I am led to surmise that he disposed of the rights in Virginia. So many who had assignments of land never came to claim it or live on it.

The DAR Patriot Index which you may have in your local library gives the birth date of William McMahon (there are several variants in the spelling) as 9 January 1749 and his death date as 30 June 1794. His wife is identified as Ann Cox.

Two wills are available in Ohio Co., West Virginia for two William McMahons- the one which might pertain to the surgeon ws dated 31 March 1794 and is found in Will Bk.1, p.29. A copy of this document may be gotten from the Clerk of the County Court.

The Filson Club History Quarterly, Vol.22, No.2 contains the Cox genealogy compiled by Mrs. Evelyn Crady Adams. She states that Major William McMahen married Ann Cox, daughter of Isaac Cox about 1772 in Hampshire County, Virginia and (2) Edward Worrell circa 1798 in Ohio County, West Virginia.

From an inquiry to the Registrar General of the DAR in 1962 I learned that one descendant of the Dr. McMechen had entered the DAR on his service. She was Mrs. Robley E. O'Farrell, Nat. No. 404748. My letter to her addressed to 3106 N. 19th Street, Tacoma, Washington was returned. Inasmuch as I believe she has resigned, I am sure you can get a copy of her paper by writing the Registrar General.

I do hope the information I am able to send you will be of interest and help to you. In Nelson County there were those with the same surname as the doctor but that family came from Culpeper, Virginia.

Dear Mr. McMahon:

The McMachen-McMahon family is extremely difficult to trace. They are prolific and the spelling of the name varies widely, as Cartmell noted long ago.

I am enclosing a mass of data that I collected while living in Baltimore and Washington. Much of it is documented but too much of it is "assumption." Perhaps with what I am sending you you can piece out your line. I have met many persons working on this family but have gained no knowledge from them.

You will observe that reference is made to the family being in Delaware in the early years. Perhaps the old Colonel came to Delaware before going on to Frederick Co. Va. I found many records in early Delaware entries but could not reconcile them with the Va. family.

I fully intended making a chart of my material but my time has been too filled with other demands. I think the data can be arranged in a chart without too much effort.

I'm sending all the information I have collected and I have no plan to pursue the work further - too busy now.

And I might add that I have no additional Cox data other than that published. Yes, I do have other information. A Lemon descendant chanced upon my Cox history after working for years trying to find early records so with my data and hers she compiled a very complete Lemon Family record.

I wish you success in your search. It is much fun but at times exasperating.

I have a great niece living in Houston and if I ever get down there to visit her I shall try to get in touch with you.

Dear Mrs. Adams:

I recently began a genealogy of my family and it turns out that apparently my direct descendant is the William Mc Mahon you refer to in your writings of "The Coxes of Cox's Creek, Kentucky" in 1948. I read your article with much interest since your reference to the settlement of William Mc Mahon's estate in 1800 lists a son, Friend. One of his descendants of De Ridder, Louisiana has Friend's Bible where Margaret Cox is recorded as his wife, just as stated in your article.

My purpose in writing is to determine whether or not you have additional information on William or his parents other than what was used in your article on the Coxes. It occurred to me that you might possibly have other information on the Mc Mahons since they were apparently close friends with the Coxes and three of William's children married Coxes. I have a copy of William's will filed in Ohio County, W. Virginia rather than Brooke County, as referred to in your article. Do you know whether William had any brothers or sisters?

In trying to obtain additional information on my family I found someone, also tracing a line of the Mc Mahons, who thinks that a Samuel Doak Mc Mahon (b 1789) was also a son of William but from the will, your writings and other sources I have never found a reference to this man as a son of William. The older people in our family say that Friend and Samuel Doak were brothers but admit that they may have been cousins.

I would appreciate any information you can give me and I am enclosing a self-addressed, stamped envelope for your convenience in replying.

Imprimis: I give and bequeath to my two daughters, Agnes and Jane McNeahan, twenty pounds current money each to be paid to them as they shall be in need, by my executors hereafter named, together with their equal proportion of my moveable estate save only what my well beloved wife Elizabeth shall think fit to dispose of to her grandchildren of my son John and William McNeahan's part of my said estate and shall be to them hereafter bequeathed;

Imprimis: I give and bequeath to my sons John, Richard and William McNeahan all the lands by me now possessed to be among them divided and that my son John endeavor to take up the surplus land lying contiguous to the said land, by getting the south line of my land straitened to take in the said surplus land and if his lordship do grant, I order by this my last will that said surplus land being made into one tract, be divided as mentioned hereafter (viz): To my son John McNeahan 200 acres of the land by me now possessed where my said son John now possesseth and his part of the surplus land if obtained of his Lordship; likewise, to my son Richard, 200 acres of said land on that part he now possesseth with his equal part of said surplus land. Likewise, my son William McNeahan to have his part or residue of said land on that part or place I now live on at the writing of this my last will, with his equal part of said surplus land, if by then obtained.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son William my riding horse, bridle and saddle.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter, Ann, one two-year old horse colt of a roan colour,

Item: I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife one mare called Tybb for her proper use save only the increase of said mare to go to the use of my children aforementioned.

Item: That my two undesignated executors sell or cause to be sold that tract or parcel of land to me belonging, lying and being in Augusta County and the money arising by such sale go towards defraying such debts as may be brought against me.

Item: I likewise appoint, constitute and ordain my two well beloved friends, Lewis Neill and Gabriel Jones, with my son John McMechan, executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former testaments, wills, legacies, requests, and executors by me in anywise before this time named, willed and bequeathed; ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

I am sorry to have been so long answering your letter of January 15th. I note you say your George Wilson who married Agnes McMaken are buried in Cromwell, Ky. This town is in Ohio County. We have a history of that county including the early marriage records, but I do not find George Wilson nor any one by the name of McMaken.

Ohio County was formed from Hardin County in 1798. I did not find anything in Hardin either.

Butler County was formed from Logan and Ohio in 1810. I looked in Logan and the only thing I find is

Wm. McMaken and Elizabeth Shelton Nov. 25, 1805

Wm. McMaken and Polly Sutton, Nov. 27, 1804.

These may have been two men or one man who married twice.




