- 1823 October 25. Wilson Yandell, Craggy Bluff, Tenn. to Lunsford Yandell, Lexington, Ky.
A letter full of moral advice. Tells of his own moral struggles as a youth. Denounces skeptics like Voltaire. Mentions that John C. Hamilton was elected judge over Stockly D. Hays. Discuss Tennessee property law.

- 1823 November 8. Wilson Yandell, Craggy Bluff to Lunsford Yandell, Lexington.
Discusses the property law and its effects on the economy. Mentions the 1823 Tennessee legislature, Judge Brown, Peter Smith, General Hall, Colonel Overton, Mr. Black. Discusses life at Transylvania University.

- 1823 November 23. Wilson Yandell, Craggy Bluff to Lunsford Yandell, Lexington.
