

The interviews were conducted in 1863-1864 by the American Freedmen's Inquiry Commission, which was part of the Army. Their purpose was to interview, thoughout the South and the border states, former slaves, free blacks, army officers, etc. to develop reconstruction policy after the war ended. This was not the same group as the Freedmen's Bureau, which operated banks, schools, etc.

These interviews are available only on microfilm from the National Archives. There is a list of all interviewees, with their locations, before the interviews begin. It doesn't take too long to go through them, if you want to come in and make copies. I'll be happy to show you how to find them on the film.
