Danville May 10th 1790

Mr. John Rodgers collected from me
money which was to be appropriated by me,
which money he informed me he paid to
you & that you was to settle with me there-
for, the sum being about seven pounds.

If this information is true will you
be pleased to pay the same to Mr. Wiesa-
gar & take his receipt therefor.

That sum will not discharge an ac^t of
Mr. Muriebie's against me which is in the
hands of Mr. Wiesagar, will you be so
obliging as to give him a Civil List or
warrant for the balance or in case you
have forwarded your warrants to Rich-
mond I shall be much obliged if you
will give Mr. Wiesagar an Order on your
agent for such balance on account, your
compliance of this request will be thank-
fully acknowledged.
