Your letter of June 5 should have been answered  
sooner but various things have interfered and I regret that, especially  
do I regret it because I cannot give you any help.

You are looking for one Morgan Pasley who was born January 13, 1828  
in Owen County, Kentucky. We do not have a copy of Owen County marriages,  
wills, etc., and therefore I think you will have to do your searching in  
that county. Owen County was formed in 1819 from Gallatin, Franklin  
and Scott counties. Scott County records burned and the marriage records  
begin in 1837. I have looked in the Franklin marriages but do not find  
any Pasleys.

We have a compilation, "Abstracts of Early Kentucky Wills and Inven-  
tories," by Miss Estelle King. Unfortunately, Owen is not included in  
this, and the only Pasley name I find in this book is where one William  
Pasley witnessed the will of John Ash, dated October 4, 1799, proven  
May 1800. This was in Nelson County, Ky.

I looked in the early marriages and wills of Nelson County but do  
not find the name Pasley.

I have used Mrs. Ardery's two volumes of Kentucky Court and other  
Records, and Kentucky Pioneer and Court Records, by Mrs. Harry Kennett  
McAdams, and find they do not help. I think therefore it will be  
necessary for you to have a genealogist to do this work, and I therefore  
suggest you write to one of the following: Miss Hattie Scott, Shelby St.,  
Frankfort, Ky.; Mrs. Eugene H. Ray, Weissinger Gaubert Apts., Louisville,  
Ky., or Mrs. George Nicholas, 1289 Willow Ave., Louisville, Ky. As Miss  
Scott is in that neighborhood she might be able to give you quicker  
service on this.

I hope sincerely that one of them can be of assistance to you.

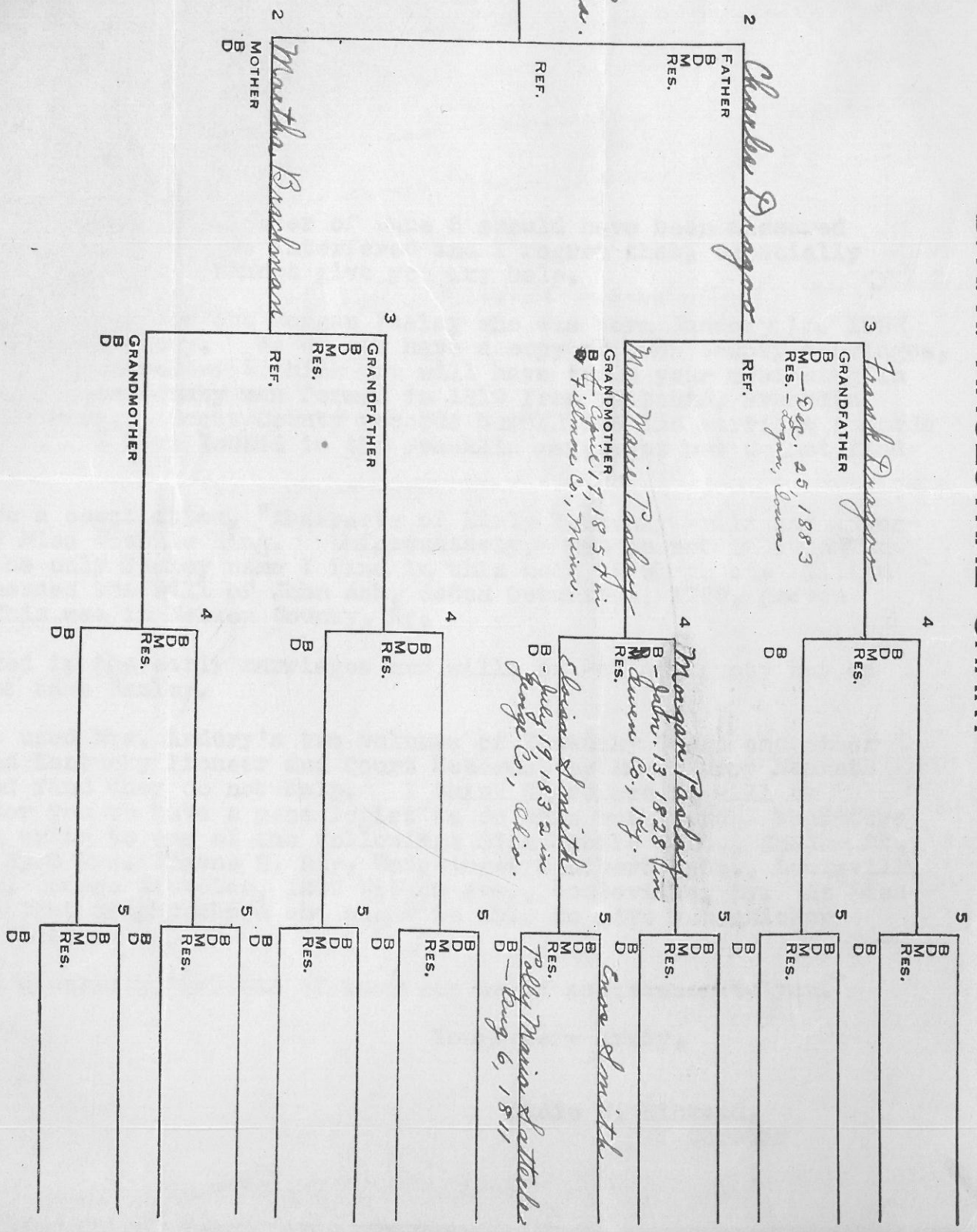

I do wish I had some good, solid information on the Paisley family. I have checked our correspondence files and our Card Catalogue Index and find no mention of this unusual surname.

The 1800 Kentucky Tax List contains these names: Thomas Pasley in Bourbon County; Henry and James Pasly in Madison County. It is quite possible that the county tax enumerator had no idea of the correct spelling of the name.

If you could give us some idea as to the date when your family came to Kentucky and the location in which they settled, perhaps I could find one or two items about them. Of course, our staff is small and we are not in a position to undertake detailed genealogical research, we are most willing to answer two or three specific questions if the information is readily found. I do wish it were possible for you to come to the Filson Club and have a look through census records and any other source material which might help you with your investigation. Let me know if I can be of further assistance to you.
