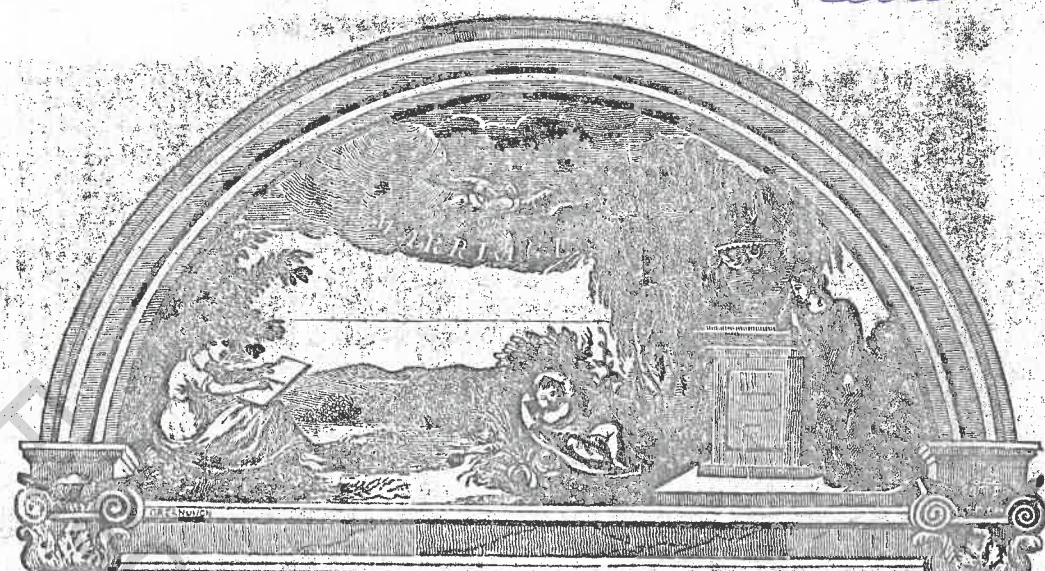

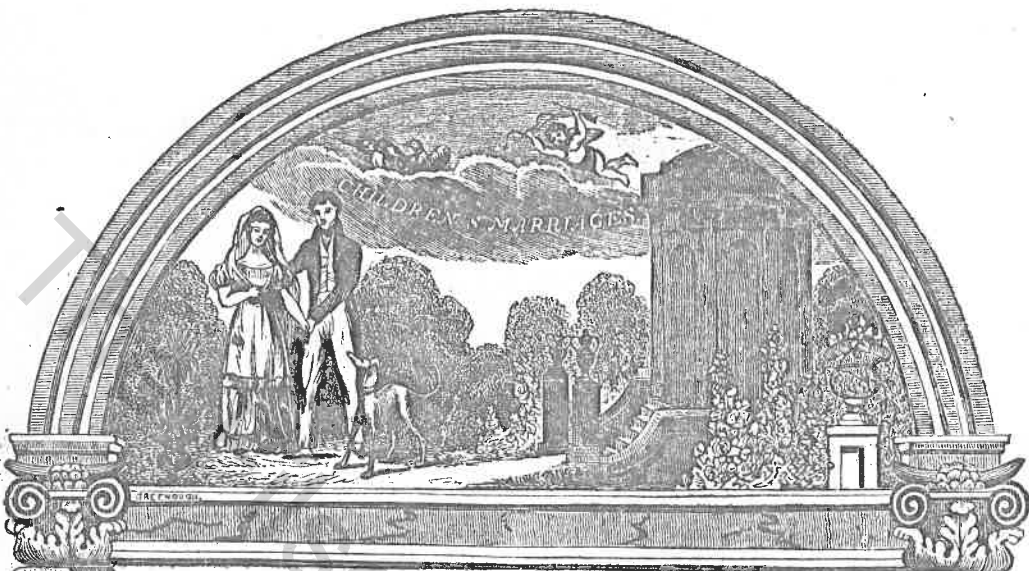

Dear Mrs. Ruppel:

Your letter of July 27th last to Hon. Patrick H. Callahan has been sent to us for reply. I wish we had the staff to do real genealogical research for those who call upon us but I am sorry we do not.

We can only look in the obvious places and therefore I have looked in the Washington County records and find the will of one Thomas Pettit, dated September 7, 1834, probated Nov. 24, 1834. This is in will book F. What we have is an abstract. His wife was Hetty and he mentions granddaughter Hetty Campbell who is to have 1/3 of Sally Givins' share of the first sale money, the rest to be equally divided amongst his wife and the other children. He refers to a daughter Lucy and then states that at his wife's death, it is to be divided between daughter Sally, granddaughter Fanny Smith, daughter Harriet Wilson who married John H. Wilson. He mentions a son Wm. H. Pettit, also a Wm. H. Pettitt son of Thomas Pettit, and refers to his son-in-law William Humphrey.

There is also a will of another Thomas Pettit, apparently the son of the above Thomas, in will book G, page 1, under date of May 21, 1828, probated Nov. 27, 1837. He leaves land, etc. to Harriet Wilson, wife of John H. Wilson. Wm. Henry Pettit was witness.

I have spent quite a little time trying to straighten your line but have not been successful. Mrs. Ray is in the library and tells me that she has done a good deal of work on the Spalding family. She does this type of work and I think you will find her fee reasonable. She is Mrs. Eugene H. Ray, Weissinger-Gaultbert Apts., Louisville, and I suggest that you get in touch with her.

My Dear Sir -

At a D. C. R. meeting recently in Erlanger, The State Librarian who was a guest told of having acquired the biography of Bishop John Lancaster Spaulding and the poem "A Kentucky Pioneer". I think thru your courtesy.

When I told her that he was some where in my family, she sent me a copy, and I am wondering if you can put me in touch with some one who could give me information.

A few years ago, over the radio, my great Aunt Mrs. Elizabeth Norton of Richmond, heard of a search for the Pettit heirs in Ky, concerning property in Dutchess Co. N.Y. left to them by Bishop Spaulding.

She looked into it and only needed the place of marriage of George M. Pettit and Ann Wills when she died suddenly, and my Mother, whom she had been corresponding with, died suddenly shortly after.

Ann Wills Pettit was my grandmother and her Mother was a Bradford, and she was supposed to be closely related to Father Spaulding.

I was living away from my home town, London during these inquiries, but my sister Thel knew a lot about it, and she is under the impression that Father Spaulding and my great, great grand-mother were brother and sister.

Also I have been informed recently that before my Mother passed away, a family named Abell came to see her and said we were related.

I find by the biography that Althea Abell was Benedict Spalding's wife, and the only place I ever heard that name was my Mother speaking of a cousin Althea.

I am gathering information of all branches of my family and would so love to get this line.

Thru the Pettits I am a direct descendant of Price Key, a Revolutionary soldier of Virginia.

When we get older these things mean more to us and are getting increasingly hard to find, so I am gathering all I can for my children and grand children.

So hoping this will reach you and you might be able to put me in touch with some one who might know the data, I remain

Your letter of September 18th was handed by Mr. Thruston to me for reply.

First I have telephoned the Book dealers here and cannot locate a copy of the 1896 Year Book of the Kentucky Society S.A.R. I am not surprised at this because I have tried before without success. Fortunately we have had several copies given us, but they are used so often we must retain them.

Another book that might interest your Society is the "Year Book of the Society, Sons of the Revolution in the Commonwealth of Kentucky 1894-1913, and Catalogue of Military Land Warrants Granted by the Commonwealth of Virginia to Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolution", compiled by Samuel M. Wilson, from Records in the State Land Office of Kentucky. Lexington, Ky., 1913. This at one time could be produced through Judge Wilson, 812 Security Trust Co., Bldg., Lexington, Ky., but I cannot say whether or not it is still available.

The other book to which you refer as Eck is "List of Revolutionary Soldiers of Virginia, Special Report of the Department of Archives and History for 1911" by H. J. Eckenrode, Archivist. Pub. by the Virginia State Library, Richmond, 1912, with a Supplement published in 1913. I suggest you try the Virginia State Library, Richmond, Va., but I fear this too is out of print and can be procured only through dealers in old books.

Now as to the Pettit material. In the Kentucky State Historical Register for 1923, Vol. 21, being "Certificate Book of the Virginia Land Commission of 1779-80" I find on page 10, where at a Court continued and held for Adjusting disputed Titles to the Kentucky Lands at St. Asaphs or Logan Fort the 15th day of October 1779. Those present are mentioned and then two names appear one of which is William Pettit.

In the same book page 14, I find "(Cert. iss'd for 1400 acres fees &c, paid deed delivered to his wife-)

"Benj. Pettit this day claimed a right of settlement & Preemption to a Tract of Land lying on the dividing ridge of the waters of the Hanging Fork a branch of Dicks River & Green River

about 7 M from this place by making corn in this County in the year 1775 and residing in the Country 12 Months, On satisfactory proof being made to the Court they are of Opinion that the said Pettitt has a right to a settlement of 400 Acres of land including the place above mentioned 1000 Acres of Land Adjoining Cert'e issued for same."

That location is of course in what was the original Lincoln County and I think still in the present Lincoln County, as Stanford is County Seat of Lincoln.

In the Lincoln County marriages I find

Benjamin Pettite and Hannah McNelly, Joseph Royslscle(?) her guardian, Aug. 27, 1793, Bondsman William Folan.

I note you state that Thomas was a pensioner from Maryland. In the 1896 Year Book of the Ky. Soc. S.A.R. I do not find Thomas in Montgomery as you state but in Shelby County, and the entry reads

"Petit, Thomas , Private..... Maryland line
November 29, 1821; April 17, 1820, \$60. Age 70."

In the same book I find in Bath County:-

"Petit, Matthew, private.....Pennsylvania line
April 9, 1819; June 17, 1818, \$96. Age 72." ~~Dirix July~~
~~Sxlix~~

We have "Abstracts of Pension Papers of Soldiers of the Revolutionary War and 1812 War who settled in Bath County, Kentucky" as compiled by Annie Walker Burns. Typed copy only. This shows that Matthew Pettit, of Pennsylvania line #35,553, on June 17th, 1818, made oath that he served 3 years as a private in Continental Army; enlisted in Pennsylvania 1777 and served till 1780 under Capt. John Finley of 8th Pennsylvania Regiment.

That his property does not amount to \$30.00 and is unable to work by reason of a wound in his arm. Is now 58 years old. Is also injured by wound in left leg. Both wounds received in Battle of Brandiwine. Has four children, the oldest being eight years of age.

Mrs. Rebecca Mitchell, sister of said Mathew Pettit testifies to his service and to his present need.

August 14th, 1820 , Bath County, Mathew Pettit, makes schedule of his property under oath, as consisting of six hogs valued at \$6.00. Has a wife, aged 42, and children; Drusillah aged 14, Nancy aged 12, Samuel aged 10, Ann aged 8, Polly aged 6, and David aged one month. Covering Jacked; Kentucky 9110.

Inscribed on Kentucky Roll at \$8.00 per month to begin 17th June 1818. Certificate of pensions issued April 6th, 1819. In the original there were six pages of record.

We also have the abstracts of the Shelby County pensions and I do not find Thomas Pettit and so may be he moved to Montgomery and there received his pension. I do not have Montgomery.

You may know about the formation of counties in Kentucky and you, on the other hand, may not have that information close at hand. Therefore, for convenience I give it below as to the counties in which we are interested.

Montgomery County was formed in 1796 from Clark, which was formed 1792 from Fayette and Bourbon, and Bourbon in 1785 from Fayette. Fayette was one of the original counties (3). Bath County was formed in 1811 from Montgomery.

In Fayette County I find the marriage record of

Geo. L. Pettit and Catharine Shedell 12-8-1838, bondsman John W. Fords.
John Pettit and Nancy Berry 5-2-1811, Wm. Berry bondsman.
William B. Pettit and Amanda D. Lammé 6-10-1843 Jefferson Lammé bondsman
Nathl. Pettit, and Patsy Clifford 3-9-1818 mother Ann Clifford
Nathl. Pettitt and Mrs. Rebecca Atchison, 6-22-1840 James Headley bondsman.

In shelby County I find the marriage record of

Simon Pettitt and Sarah Knapp July 31, 1817

"Kentucky Pioneer and Court Records" by Mrs. Harry Bennett McAdams publishes on page 153 etc., has some Montgomery County Ky., marriages as taken from an old newspaper, being the marriage records kept by some preacher. In that I find where Japthah Kemper and Nancy Pettit married Jan. 25, 1821; also Samuel Pettit and Susan Coons, Oct. 31, 1826.

Also in the same book under Clark Co.,

Asa T. Pettitt and Sally Ann John, June 24, 1830.

We also have the marriage records of Clark County as copied by Dr. Doyle one of our members, in which I find

Asa T. Pettitt and Sally Ann Johns, June 21, 1830,
Bondsman Mason Morris. Teste; A. G. Tramel
Consent of Anderson Johns, father of Sally Ann Johns, and Thomas Pettit.

Regretting that we cannot locate the Ky. Sec. Year Book for 1896, and hoping the above will fit in your notes in some way, I am,

Dear Mr. Arps;

I have taken a look at what we have in our collection and have not been able to solve your genealogical request.

In Madison County Marriages I see the marriage of a Benjamin Petit to Charity Billin 12-23-1800. Also in Lincoln Co. Ky. the marriage of Benjamin Pettitt to Hannah McNelly Augu 27, 1793.

In 1790 there is a Benjamin Petitt listed in the 1790 Tax list and a Thomas Pettitt in Mason Co. in 1790. In 1800 a Benjamin Sr. and a Benjamin Jr. are in Lincoln Co.

I am enclosing a letter from our Pettis folder here in our files. This may fit in somehow to your Pettis line.

I have checked in listings for Revolutionary soldiers and do not find a Thomas Skidmore. I do see a Rev. soldier in Lincoln Co. by the name of Joseph Skidmore.

Note.

I have before me a lot of data, just received, which intrigues me somewhat, as it discloses some early Ky. history in re "Pettit". Thomas Pettit and Lieutenant Benjamin Pettit raised crops of corn at Boonsboro in 1775. (Depositions in Circuit Court taken around 1790) (Draper's Mss. at Madison, Wis. also confirm both of said persons in Boonsboro books 1775). Another brother disclosed as William. All seem to have been in the Revolutionary service, and it could have been only after settling in Ky. This segregates them from others of the name, also in Kentucky, viz.: Thomas, a pensioner from Maryland, living in Montgomery Co. 1840, and Matthew, a pensioner, living in Bath in 1840. Thomas and Benjamin bought lands on Paint Creek (Pettit's Station) as referred to by Collins. Gov. Randolph granted one tract as amilitary tr. For several years I have had inquiries about Pettits in Ky. Have never been able to connect them, except Maryland Thomas, with eastern branches.

Three "Thomas-es" came to America, viz.:

1. Thomas, my ancestor, to Boston with Winthrop 1630, later migrating to Long Island. Died 1658 at Newtown, L. I.
2. Thomas, Accomac County, Va. died 1641, will. His wife was daughter of ROBINSON CUSTIS, and his line quite prominent in Va. including Elizabeth, who md. Gen. Cropper; also Governor Wise *in down line*.
3. Thomas, Maryland, early. Practically nothing as to line.

Thanks for your letter of July 21, and I apologize for just now getting time to reply. We have had a busy summer here at The Filson Club, and I have been away on vacation.

I have looked at what sources we have here, and am unable to find any clues as to who the parents of Rachel Pettit/Petit may be. There seems to be no connection with what we have here on the Pettitt line.

I did look at the marriage records we have for Henry Co. and according to the abstracts, Owen Malin married Rachel Petty/Pettitt March 27, 1817 and the date of 25 October, 1832 is the marriage of Isaac Malin to Polly Snell. I do not find an Aaron or Moses listed in any of the census indexes.

I would be very glad to see what you have done on the Malin family, and thank you for sharing this with me.

Dear Mrs. Oliver:

It was so nice of you to answer my letter, inquiring about my great-great grandmother, Rachel Pettit (Petit). I shall give you what I know about her. I am especially interested in learning who her parents and grandparents were. I have some information on early Pettits (Petits) but I have been unable to make a connection between them and Rachel since I don't know anything about her parents.

I was also interested to learn that you come from the Rev. Isaac Malin. His son Owen was Rachel's husband, and I know that he performed their marriage ceremony. I do have a bit of information about the Rev. Isaac and I will be glad to share it with you. (We call him the Rev. Isaac, because his father, grandfather and great-grandfather were all also named Isaac. That is one way I can keep them straight! I will put together the line that I know and send it on to you. But for today, I will give you the information on Rachel. I am very hopeful that you will be able to help me.

RACHEL PETTIT (PETIT) - *brothers (Moses + Aaron)*

B: 2 Oct. 1795 near Louisville, Kentucky

D: 10 Feb. 1887, in Barnes City, Mahaaka Co., Iowa

25 Oct. 1832 Henry Co. records. ***I can't account for the great discrepancy in dates.*

Married Owen Malin and went to Parke Co., Indiana. Owen died there at age 46. Rachel then went to Iowa by covered wagon with her adult son, Washington Malin (my great grandfather). In Iowa, she remarried, a man named Wymore.

She is said to have had at least 2 brother, Moses and Aaron.
