I can afford to pay you \$25.00 to help me find out about John and Mary (Newman) Vermillion my gr. gr. Grandfather. They were in Bracken Ky. in 1817 when Jackson Perry V, my great Grandfather was born. <sup>(He said Bracken Co, Ky. in the Paxton Annual of Platte Co, Ky.)</sup> <sup>(parents)</sup> <sup>b. 1785-1790?</sup> <sup>If not, where?</sup> (?)

John V. must have been born in Md. but where? I'd like the names of his other children, too. Elias V. must have been one. Others could be: Malinda, Milla, James B., John B. + Mary E. Did John + Mary move to Ohio after 1830? When did he die, - and where? When wed to Mary Newman? Where?

I simply cannot get any photostats until I find out more about John V. States I've written to want much more info than I can give them. For example: in what county etc. Please try to help me. <sup>Mr. Bushey</sup> <sup>you</sup> once that this John was a son of John b. 1763, son of Robert b. 1725. <sup>(over)</sup>

I was a John V. on the 1820 Census + 1830 Census wife children of Bracken Co. Ky. No family name on the statement sent to me.

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Until I find out about John V., my gr. gr.  
Grandfather, I can prove nothing. It's too bad  
my Great Grandfather, Jackson Perry V. didn't  
give more info to Mr. Paxton who wrote the  
Paxton Annals of Platte Co., Mo. He merely said his  
parents were John V. and Mary Newman.  
(In Mason Co. 1850 before leaving for Mo. in 1860)

Dear Sir:

I am hopeful that you will help me. I've been trying for a long time to find out all about my gr. gr. grandfather, John Neomillion who, according to the Paxton Annals of Mo., wed a Mary Newman. He had a son Jackson Perry V. b. 1817, - my great grandfather. He was listed on the 1850 Census of Mason Co., Ky. Two sons served in the Civil War: Moses Lafayette V. b. 1845 and Albert Peyton V. b. 1843. (My Grandfather Taylor Jackson V. b. 1847)

There was a John V. listed on the Bracken Co. Census for 1820 + 1830, - just his name, not his wife's or any children. Jackson Perry V., his son, is said to have been born in Bracken Co., Ky. John V.,



having a son born 1817, would have had to have been born between 1785-1795, — but where? Who were his other children? Was Mary Newman the mother of all his children? The Dayton Annals lists her, because, I imagine, a son, Jackson Perry V, gave that as her name.

There was an Edward V. listed on the 1840 Census of Mason Co. Mo. I understand these were V's in Mercer Co.; too.

Please help me. I cannot afford to hire a genealogist. Thank you!

Dear Miss Vermillion:

If the genealogical information you wish to find were in easy reach, I would be more than delighted to send it to you. We have very few records of Bracken and Mason Counties. By far and large, proven facts about our forebears must come from careful research in county court records.

The 1790 and 1800 Kentucky Tax Lists mention none with the surname of Vermillion. Census records listed, by name, only the head of a household up until 1850 when individual members of a family were mentioned. It is possible that John Vermillion's family were grouped in the census of 1820 and 1830 under males and females. Unless, of course, he was living alone.

Genealogical fees in this part of the country are not too expensive and I know of no substitute for original research when there are no printed records of individuals. I do regret that I have no clues for you and no information which would be of help to you.
