In Compliance with the Order of the Court bearing date on the 29th day of September 1829: Your Commissioner on the 20th and 21st days of January last, attended at the house of Mrs. Mary Wallace, by request of the parties, and proceeded to examine title & State the Account of Wm Wallace administrator of Thos. Wallace decd. - The Account will be seen on the third and fourth pages of this report - The result is that, there is due from the said Administrator on the 20th day of January last \$704.71, besides forty Shares of Bank Stock in his hands - Your Commissioner then proceeded to make such Account of^{the} advancements to the children of the said Thomas Wallace as is required by the order under which he acted - The result will be seen on the 5th page of this report. Your Commissioner lastly proceeded to fix the sums of money, necessary to complete the education of the defendant John W. Wallace, in as liberal a manner as the eldest children of the testator Thomas Wallace were educated in the life time of their father, and to maintain him, and the defendants Thomas H. Wallace and Frances A. Wallace until they respectively attain their ages of twenty one years - Upon full Consideration, Your Commissioner has allowed for this purpose \$2200 in the whole, to be divided as follows Viz: \$200 a year to John W. Wallace for seven years. - \$200 a year for four years to Frances A. Wallace, and to Thomas H. Wallace nothing, he being now within a few months of his age of twenty years, and his Education not requiring it, nor does he ask for any allowances. - The Surplus if any after effecting the object of the allowance is to be returned to the Estate for future distribution. The evidence as to the ages of these three Children, was the record of the births ^{contained} in the family Bible, and in ascertaining the allowance to which they are entitled your Commissioner received the Statements of Mrs. Mary Wallace their Mother, who informed him in what manner the eldest Children had been educated, and also what their Support had cost, and would probably cost in future they (with the exception of Thos. H. Wallace who lives in New Orleans) having lived with her, and intending to continue with her in all probability until they become of age or marry. - The Account of Wm Wallace administrator is stated without regard to interest at his request - The interest Account would evidently be in his favour, as is entirely apparent from inspection of the Account - The Account on the debit side is supported by proper Vouching unless the Contrary appears opposite to the items not so supported - All which is respectfully submitted to the Court -

To the Honorable the Judge of the Superior Court of Chancery for the Fredericksburg, District. - The undersigned three of the Commissioners named in the order of September 29th 1829 in the cause of James B. Wallace and others plaintiffs against Mary Wallace and others defendants, respectfully submit the following Report of their proceedings in execution of the same. -

1. The undersigned have set apart, out of the Estate of Thomas Wallace deceased, all the Bank Stock reported by Commissioner Maury to be in the hands of the defendant William Wallace's hands, as Administrator, belonging to the said Estate as a fund sufficient for the education and maintenance of the infant defendants, according to the same Commissioner's report; whereof the dividends are to be first applied towards the object aforesaid, and if they be insufficient, the Administrator may dispose of such amount of the Stock itself as may be necessary for the purpose of such education and maintenance. The Undersigned have set apart this fund, at the desire and request of all the legates of the said Thomas Wallace, who are now present, who concur in the opinion, that it is equally the desire of the absent legates. -

2. The undersigned have left in the hands of the defendant William Wallace as Administrator the sum of Three hundred and Six dollars 96 Cents part of the sum of \$706.96 reported by Commissioner Maury to be in his hands. - This sum of \$300.96 is left in his hands to meet contingent expenses and is to be divided (after defraying such expenses) hereafter together with the Bank Stock. -

3. The undersigned have then ascertained the Amount of the personal Estate to be now divided, by adding together the balance of \$400.00 in the hands of the defendant William Wallace as Administrator; the aggregate of Advancements, reported by Commissioner Maury, to wit: \$1027.84 and the values of Sixty one Slaves as estimated by them (according to the Subjoined list) at \$14557.00 the sum total of which is \$25234.84. - This being divided gives nine Shares of \$2803.87 $\frac{2}{3}$ each. - James B. Wallace having received advancements beyond his Share to the Amount of \$906.12 $\frac{2}{3}$ is to refund so much, in the proportions, and to the persons hereinafter mentioned. - To William A. Winston & Wife have been allotted the Slaves, Nancy & Lewis at \$425. which being added to the advancements charged to them, give them an overplus of \$27.01 $\frac{1}{3}$ which overplus he is to refund as is hereinafter mentioned. - To Arthur H. Wallace has been allotted the sum of \$468.87 $\frac{2}{3}$ to be paid him by James B. Wallace which with the advancements charged to him makes his full share. - To Albert Wallace have been allotted the Slaves Dennis, Aggy, Aaron, Nelson, Malv, Anna, and Simon, valued at \$1722.00 and also the sum of \$156.87 $\frac{2}{3}$ to be paid him by James B. Wallace, making together with his advancements his full share. - To William Wallace have been allotted the Slaves Solomon, Bill Cox, James, Bill Harriett & Patty valued at \$1750.00, and also the sum of \$153.87 $\frac{2}{3}$ to be retained out of the \$400.00 in his hands as Administrator, making

with his advancement, his full share. - To Caroline H. Wallace have been allotted the Slaves, Penina, Harrison, Elijah, Wiolet, Ruben, Lucy, Kesiak, Lotty, Patty & Hannah, valued at \$2750.00. and also the sum of \$13.87 1/2 to be paid her out of the \$400.00 in the hands of the defendant, William Wallace, as Administrator, making her full share. - To Thomas H. Wallace have been allotted the Slaves Beverly, Tom, Jack, Abby, Willig, Michaela, Lows Children, Charlotte, Angelina, Tom & Andrew, valued at \$2545.00 and also the sum of \$258.87 1/2 to be paid him by James B. Wallace, making his full share. - To Frances A. Wallace have been allotted the Slaves Eliza and her Child Carter, Rody and three Children, Melinda, Carter, Simon, Jacob, Peggy, Lenny & Louisa, valued at \$2700.00 and also the sum of \$103.87 1/2 to be paid her out of the \$400.00 in the hands of the defendant, William Wallace as Administrator making her full share. - And to John W. Wallace have been allotted the Slaves, John, Anne, Daphne, John, Isaac, Winney, Jackson Henry, Mary, Shadrach and Bob, valued at \$2675.00 and also three Sums of money, to-wit: the residue of James B. Wallace's overplus \$21.19 1/3 the residue of the \$400. in the hands of the defendant, William Wallace as Administrator \$78.37 and the sum of \$29.01 1/3 to be paid him by the defendant, William A. Winston as his overplus, the aggregate of which is his full share. - The following is a list of the 61 Slaves, with their values as estimated by the Undersigned. -
