Biographical Note

Luther Henry White (1920-1945) was a World War II soldier from Louisville, Kentucky. He served with the U.S. Army Air Corps in the Pacific. He was killed on a mission over Japan on 9 May 1945.

Scope and Content Note

Papers include correspondence focusing on White's service with the U.S. Army Air Corps in World War II, describing impressions of basic training, flight training, bombardier training, and work as an instructor. Letters touch upon the war and patriotism, but are mostly concerned with everyday life, writing of hunting, listening to the radio, growing a Victory Garden, traveling, and his affection for his family. Letters to White's family after his death focus on the grief of loved ones.
